The state of South Carolina owns a mansion, several stadiums and arenas, enough forested land to cover about half of Rhode Island and a bunch of buildings to store stuff, train workers and hold prisoners. But until recently, South Carolina did not have a complete list of state-owned buildings and property.

Note: Haley issued an executive order in October requesting the state's 107 agencies report what they held to see if they could find any excess property to sell.

Note: "It's time to simplify the books, it's time to clean it up," Haley said after signing the order.
