Tobul Accumulator, which occupies an industrial site on Accumulator Street and an office building on Main Street, will be expanding into a newly constructed industrial building at the CrossRhodes Industrial Park on U.S. 301. The park is owned by the SouthernCarolina Alliance. The company plans to expand and upfit the building to accommodate its growing sales and manufacturing operations.

At Thursday's grand opening ceremonies for Tobul Accumulator's new facility and expansion, Haley thanked Jim Tobul, company president, for having faith in the small, rural community. The probe ended in March 2012 with S.C. State's board of trustees never seeking a final report.

Aiken and Edgefield counties could find it more difficult to grow industry and attract new businesses as a result of stronger air quality standards being considered on the federal level, according to national and state environmental regulators. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is reviewing rule changes that may put

more than half of South Carolina counties, including Aiken and Edgefield, at risk of falling out of compliance with federal smog standards, a designation that would create more stringent emission limits.

It appears that Boeing's comments about the smoldering batteries on its 787 have annoyed the National Transportation Safety Board. Boeing gave its own account of two battery incidents, which include a fire, at a detailed press briefing in Tokyo last week. The problem is that the NTSB is still investigating the incidents. In a letter to Boeing, the NTSB says failure to provide advance notice of what company officials would say at the briefing is "inconsistent with our expectations" for a party to an investigation.
