# Governors' Campaign Finance Problems, Oldest Legislator Ousted and More

Four years ago, Kansas GOP Gov. Sam Brownback and other conservatives managed to unseat eight moderate Republicans in the state Senate who had blocked parts of his agenda. This year, the moderate wing is hoping to exact its revenge.

Backed by an unusual bipartisan coalition of former governors unhappy with the direction in which Brownback has taken the state, dozens of moderates are challenging conservative incumbents in next Tuesday's House and Senate primaries. And they have a good chance of winning many of the races. A number of the challengers have outlasted their incumbent opponents, and a May poll showed Brownback had the lowest approval rating of any U.S. governor, at 26 percent. **KEEP READING >>**
