2. I have spent 37 years in the employ of the State of South Carolina, which covers most of my productive working years.
3. My present annual take home pay is..... \$ 9,804.00

5. My present necessary, Fixed obligations would be more

RE: Act 1198 (1968)

Dear Mr. Smith:

The 1968 General Assembly passed enabling legislation in order to establish "orderly, sound, efficient and unhampered marketing, grading and standardizing of commodities they produce and in promoting and increasing the sale and proper use of such commodities". The first marketing order to be approved was The Soybean Marketing Order No. 1 which became effective October 1, 1969.

This marketing order provides for a 1/2 cent per bushel assessment to be collected from the producer by the dealer or handler. Assessment fees collected will be deposited by the Commission in a predetermined bank account of the particular commodity boards. These assessments will amount to approximately \$70,000.00 during the three or four months in which collections are made.

The Agriculture Commission of South Carolina held their monthly meeting October 7, 1969 and during the Executive Session a motion was made and approved by the Commission requesting that funds amounting to approximately \$6,000.00 be made available to the South Carolina Soybean Board.

This request is being made in order to provide funds for this Board to operate from until such time as producer assessments are collected in sufficient sums to maintain their self-supporting operation. The Department of Agriculture has an appropriation for Promotion and Expansion of Agricultural Products from which approximately \$6,000.00 could be made available if this request is approved to set this board up in operation.

When receipts from these assessments became sufficient to repay the Department, the funds which had been used by the Board would be reimbursed to the Department of Agriculture. The receipts from these assessments should be collected and deposited by the end of February 1970 at which time all funds of the Department which were previously used by the Soybean Board would be repaid.

Your consideration of this matter would be greatly appreciated.
