1. On September 17: The committee heard a panel of experts from around the country in higher education.
2. On September 24: CHE presented as well as representatives of the Technical College system
  - Dr. Jimmie Williamson, Executive Director of the Technical College System Board discussed the governing structure of the board over the 16 colleges in the system. He discussed the functions of the board that are independent of CHE as well as where the board works cooperatively with CHE and its approval authority.
  - Tim Hofferth, Chairman of CHE, provided testimony that, at the board level, CHE has lost its way and lost its vision. Currently the board is working to provide clarity and a collective call to action.
