Just recently, Governor Haley signed into law a new measure that provides a system for post-disaster reentry certification for commercial businesses and entities that assist in the restoration of utilities. Under this new law, a registered business or utility that is certified by the South Carolina Emergency Management Division will be allowed to reenter or remain in a curfew area for the purpose of transporting goods or services.
