Held in conjunction with Women's History Month, the South Carolina Women of Achievement awards commemorate women's history by honoring and remembering those women whose lives and contributions have positively affected both South Carolina and the nation. The awards presentation ceremony is scheduled for March of 2007 at Columbia College.

South Carolina thrives because of its strong women leaders and their endeavors to improve the quality of life in our state. The South Carolina Women of Achievement Awards gives us an opportunity to honor these remarkable women whose efforts helped build a hopeful future for all South Carolinians. We ask that you take time to nominate a deserving woman who has made a difference in the lives of those she serves.

The selection process and criteria for nominees are specified in detail below. The deadline for completed nominations is October 1, 2006, at 5PM. The 2007 winners will be selected from those who have promoted women in three categories: (1) **Economic Autonomy**, (2) **Political Participation**, and (3) **Health and Well Being**. Two winners will be selected from each category. Additionally, a **Pioneer** award will be given. This winner may be living or deceased.

Thank you for your support of the Women of Achievement Awards sponsored by the South Carolina Commission on Women. Together we can continue to identify and acknowledge women who exemplify excellence in service, leadership, community visibility and professionalism.

In your own words, state what the nominee accomplished during her lifetime for the improvement of life for women and all citizens of South Carolina. Among the topics the narrative statement should address are:

- How the nominee has made significant and enduring contributions to her field(s) of endeavor,
- The specific ways in which the nominee has elevated the status of women and helped open new frontiers for women or for society in general; and
- How she has inspired others by her example.

5. Criteria Selection: The South Carolina Women of Achievement Awards

Honorees are chosen based on three criteria:

1. She must have been born in or have adopted South Carolina as her home state.
2. She must have made significant and enduring contributions to her fields of endeavor, elevated the status of women and, opened new frontiers for women and for society in general.
3. She must have through her life and works inspired others by her example and exhibited exemplary community/professional leadership and professional service.
4. **The Pioneer Award** is presented to one distinguished individual or organization, who by their achievements has contributed uniquely to the improvement of the status and advancement of women.

The awards are open to all citizens of South Carolina. Former nominees are eligible. Former winners, current members of the South Carolina Commission on Women or their immediate family, and elected state officials are not eligible.
