Yes. To assist with Evacs as adjunct determined needed. And there is a statute letting NH direct guard in emergencies so it makes sense to include.

As for emd plan, we used the order they provided. This was my only true addition. The other changes were cosmetic. I did look at their hurricane plan earlier in reference to emergency status. It addresses the guard helping before (such as for lane reversals), and then at 0-6 hours before storm it addresses the guard being prepared to go to affected area. There is a line in-between not related to guard, but generally, about sheltering during storm. I will double-check but I think it is silent as to help during the hurricane. Probably because we don't want to send help in harms way (the Storm) unless specifically needed for good reason.
