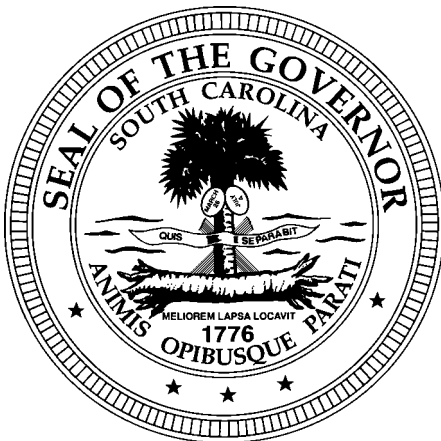
Governor Jim Hodges
