'I THINK YOU SHOULD WEAR A SEATBELT ALL THE TIME, 100% EVEN IF YOU'RE ONLY DRIVING A HUNDRED YARDS' 'IT SAVES YOUR LIFE AND IT'S GOOD TO DO THAT' SAVING LIVES IS THE GOAL OF THE LEGISLATION HEADED TO GOVERNOR SANFORD'S DESK, BUT HE'S NOT SURE HE'S READY TO SIGN OFF ON THE BILL. 'WE ALL KNOW THAT IT MAKES A LOT OF SENSE TO WEAR YOUR SEATBELT, BUT RIGHT NOW THAT'S IN THE AREA OF PERSONAL JUDGMENT' THE BILL DOESN'T ALLOW FOR CLICK- IT-OR-TICKET CAMPAIGNS, LETTING OFFICERS SET UP ROADBLOCKS TO CHECK FOR SEATBELTS.
