#### Description/Significant Features:

The building is a small shed measuring 10 by 6.7 feet (3.0 x 2.0 meters) and is 7.3 feet (2.2 meters) high. The shed is made entirely of concrete, including the roof. The entrance to the shed is located on the northeast wall. The door has been removed as have the hinges, although the eye-bolt for the lock is still present on the west side of the entryway. The shed has no windows. However, there are eight vents; four on each side wall (see photo DSCN0352).

### **Historical Information**

Historical Information:

This building was likely a storage shed for explosives and may have been used by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s. This shed is similar in form to explosives sheds used by the CCC located in the Francis Marion National Forest. CCC Camp Ellison D. Smith was located approximately 400 meters northeast of the shed location. The camp location is currently located on private land and has not been recorded as an archaeological site. The shed is located along the same road as the CCC camp. This structure is recorded as archaeological site 38OC667 and will be protected from future land disturbing activities.
