### Spotlight: Forestry Industry in South Carolina

South Carolina's abundant forests provide locally grown raw materials that supplement an industry that makes up one of the largest economic sectors in the state. Covering 13.1 million acres, the Palmetto State's forests span over 68% of our state's total land area and contain our #1 harvested crop, timber.

As the industry continues to prosper, well-known, forestry-dependent companies like Portucel, Canfor, and MeadWestvaco have all established or expanded their presence in South Carolina over the past two years.

And while our forests reach far and wide physically, their economic impact is wide-reaching as well. With an annual impact of \$17 billion, South Carolina's forestry industry is ever important to our economy. In a state with a variety of manufacturing sectors represented, the forestry industry employs the most per industry, sustaining over 90,000 jobs in the Palmetto State. This is truly an industry South Carolina wants to ensure keeps on growing.
