 - The CHE, in turn, continued to express concerns over the lack of upfront private contributions toward the project, and CHE chairman Tim Hofferth continued to express his opinion that Coastal Carolina's financial projections do not thoroughly anticipate the cost of making this move to the FBS and Sun Belt.
 - This was the fourth time since February the university has brought the stadium proposal to the CHE for needed approval.
 - "We take the responsibility very seriously. This is not an easy decision. We champion everything that you're about as an institution," Hofferth said prior to the vote. " ... At the end of the day, I've talked to a lot of athletic directors, a lot of presidents throughout the country, to bring it without significant private funding in today's environment [is risky]. The question is what's significant? I don't know. There's 13 [different] significant answers here. The fact of the matter is it's very relevant and the thing that I'm afraid of, the costs on the operating side are nowhere near what you anticipate them to be. ...
 - "That's my greatest concern in this environment. I want to get there. I'm just not there yet." ...
 - And so once again the commission had plenty of questions and concerns – above all else, the lack of committed private donations toward the project.
 - While the state does not provide the money for such capital projects, it takes on the liability if a school can't pay off its debts from the bonds that do fund the operation.

- "I want to figure out a way to support it. I know this, for me the most important part is the private source of funding," Hofferth said. "That's a hard number. That number when it comes in, if it's \$10 million, \$15 [million], \$20 million, that's a hard number that regardless of economic conditions or the trends in higher education it [can be counted on]."
- Said Terrye Seckinger, a CHE commissioner from Mount Pleasant: "I don't want you to make a mistake that's going to bankrupt your institution in a brief moment of excitement about football. I get it. We've got to calm down and look at the downside. We want to see, what are the downsides of this and why was there not a lot of money immediately when the Sun Belt came? ... I have to understand that I'm making a prudent financial decision, and I'm not convinced of that because of lack of private funding [and] lack of initiative [when thoughts of changing conferences] started."

 - As a result, Coastal Carolina has found itself trying to push through a significant stadium expansion budgeted at \$38 million at a time when the vetting process for such capital projects has never been more exhaustive. It could be looked at as bad timing for the university, or the start of a new reality for schools across the state.
 - But, Hofferth emphasized, the CHE is not fundamentally opposed to what Coastal Carolina wants to do – the group simply wants to make sure the best decisions are being made by all parties.
 - "We want to figure out a way to be able to say yes to this project," Hofferth said. "It's not an adversarial type deal. They probably need to understand a little bit more about what I'm describing and see if there's a way to get that done. That's the spirit and intent to [how] we're going at this."

Charting a new course in higher education governance has been a topic of debate during my entire administration. After years of proposals – accountability-based funding, consolidation of governance into a board of regents, and even privatizing many of the components of our state’s college and university complex – nothing has changed.

We need a globally competitive educational system more now than ever, so we have to get serious about coordination and oversight. I appointed a new Chair to the Commission on Higher Education (CHE) last year and recommended additional resources for the commission to vet capital projects and budgets.

Coastal Carolina University is proposing a stadium expansion to meet the demands of a new athletic conference. The project, primarily funded by tuition-backed debt, nearly doubled in cost since its original proposal just last fall. Even after revising the cost down to a 50% increase, the numbers simply don’t work.

Coastal Carolina University deployed an aggressive lobbying effort to bypass CHE’s statutory responsibility to review and consider higher education capital projects, resulting in this proviso. To make matters worse, a nominal amount of funding was attached to the offending language to guarantee it would survive a legal challenge based on the Supreme Court’s ruling in SC Public Interest Foundation v. Lucas.

Such actions by a public institution are disappointing, and the fact that legislators have chosen to go along is even more so. In a year where our communities, schools, and businesses are crying out for a better educated and prepared workforce, this veto represents a clear choice between the best interests of students and out-of-control higher ed spending.
