**2002-03 South Carolina Need-based Grants**

The South Carolina General Assembly established the South Carolina Need-Based Grants Program in 1996 to provide additional financial assistance to South Carolina's neediest students. Students are required to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form to be considered for the Need-based Grant. The S.C. Higher Education Tuition Grants Commission administers the program for students attending independent institutions in South Carolina. For students attending public institutions, the offices of financial aid administer the program.

Full-time students may receive up to \$2,500 per year and part-time students may receive up to \$1,250 per year. Based on the results of the FAFSA and available funding, the institution determines exact award amounts. The grant must be applied directly towards the cost-of-attendance. Recipients may receive a Need-based Grant for a maximum of eight full-time equivalent semesters toward the first one-year certificate or diploma, first associate degree, and first baccalaureate degree.

For the 2002-03 academic year, \$15.3 million was disbursed to 23,450 State Need-based Grant recipients with an average award amount of \$653 as of August 31, 2003. On the following pages, we have provided the number of recipients and the average award at each institution; the number of recipients by ethnic group; the number of recipients by gender; the number of recipients by student level; the number of recipients by enrollment status; retention statistics; and the number of recipients by county.
