Subject: County Organizations and Needs

Director Adams and Ashlie: Below are the county needs given to the Governor by county emergency managers this morning on a conference call. The following counties were not on the call, so our office is reaching out to these emergency managers today: Newberry, Greenwood, Orangeburg.

SUMTER COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: United Ministries and United Way; Also Red Cross, Salvation Army, Southern Baptists, and other churches
- Biggest Needs: Clean-out kits (flood/mud buckets) – The County Emergency Manager, Erik Hayes (803-983-8137), plans to schedule a meeting with these groups this week.

WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: None specifically mentioned; Suggest reaching out to County Emergency Manager Tiffany Cooks (843-372-9987)
- Biggest Needs: All household items (food, clothes, cleaning supplies, pet food, etc.) – All three distribution sites in the county run out of supplies within a few hours of opening.

RICHLAND COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: United Way, Red Cross, Harvest Hope, Operation Blessing, Southern Baptists, Salvation Army, Helping Hands, Heart to Hand, DSS
- Biggest Needs: Approximately 40-50 volunteers are needed to work five distribution sites with a sixth site to open this week. The sites distribute water and food to the public. Hours are from 8am-6:30pm. Unsure of a contact (perhaps United Way).

DILLON COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: Pee Dee Baptist Association, Red Cross
- Biggest Needs: 16 mobile homes have leaky roofs and large industrial tarps are needed – Director Stenson may have already had ESF-18 process this request.

SALUDA COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: Christ Central Ministries

- Biggest Needs: Leaky roofs; One heavily affected resident – Note the county is NOT expected qualify for FEMA IA

LAURENS COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: Local United Way
- Biggest Needs: Need about 25 large industrial tarps for leaky roofs; Also many residents with basement flooding – Note the county is NOT expected to qualify for FEMA IA

BAMBERG COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: Cheese and Cracker Box
- Biggest Needs: Residents within the city seem to have no unmet needs, but residents down by the river need or will need help with cleaning supplies and clean-up efforts.

GEORGETOWN COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: Winyah Bay VOIA Group (all organizations: Salvation Army, Baptist Disaster Relief)
- Biggest Needs: Flood Bucket / Mud-Out Kits and cleaning supplies; Donation Warehouse open in Andrews

DARLINGTON COUNTY:

- Lead Organizations: Red Cross, Harvest Hope
- Biggest Needs: Unsure; Mud Buckets and cleaning supplies may be helpful – NAACP and Rotary are meeting today to discuss needs.

Below is a list of counties reporting no unmet needs; However, we may need to double-check with these organizations:

- **Marlboro** – Red Cross, DSS – Schools are collecting supplies this week due Friday
- **Colleton** – County ESF and Red Cross (no United Way)
- **Edgefield** – Baptist Association, Red Cross
- **Barnwell** – United Way and Axis Center
- **Berkeley** – Multiple VOADs, Red Cross, and several local churches
- **Clarendon** – Calvary Baptist, Harvest Hope, United Ministries, Friendship House, Council on Aging
- **Lexington** – Lexington Interfaith, Harvest Hope, Salvation Army, Southern Baptists
- **Kershaw** – Red Cross, United Way, Southern Baptists
- **Charleston** – Southern Baptists, Salvation Army (Note that these groups have been helping with flood buckets and food donations)
- **Dorchester** – Christian Aid Ministries, United Methodists, Salvation Army, Southern Baptists (Note that these organizations meet once per week to discuss needs and services)
- **Aiken** – Southern Baptists
- **Horry** – County ESF, Salvation Army, other faith-based groups
- **Hampton** – None mentioned
- **Chesterfield** – None mentioned
