Charles Towne Landing Artifact Highlight: North Italian marbled slipware

These are fragments of a 17th century ceramic water flask used by the colonists at Charles Towne Landing State Historic Site. The slipware is named for their place of manufacture and the marbled appearance that was created by swirling different colored alluvial clays on the surface before firing. Wares like this hint at the complex transnational trade networks that helped make foreign products available to the colonists as they set out to establish a new colony in Carolina.
