**WHEREAS,** Frederick Hart, a world-renowned artist who was raised in Conway, South Carolina, and studied at the University of South Carolina, came to be known as one of the world's greatest figurative sculptors; and

**WHEREAS,** during his career, he created an amazing body of work that is found throughout the world, many of which are public monuments and memorials, with his most well-known works being the *Three Soldiers* sculpture at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and the monumental bas relief framing the entrance of the National Cathedral; and


**WHEREAS,** his work embodies the highest standards of excellence and demonstrates the impact art can have on society by rekindling the importance of artistic expression and appreciation of beauty by all citizens; and

**WHEREAS,** the University of South Carolina and the McKissick Museum will host an exhibit of approximately 20 sculptures by Frederick Hart which will coincide with a weekend of guest speakers who will pay tribute to this extraordinary artist with discussions of his life and work and related topics regarding traditional and modern art.
