This would get them off of government assistance, as well, so it would help two aspects of economic recovery.

I'm sure that you're doing everything you can to see jobs move into our state, but it really breaks my heart to see these plants that are sitting vacant and running down. To imagine that they used to be thriving cotton mills and bustling production facilities makes a good citizen wish for new businesses to move into them once again.


