The breakdown of the Care for Children in Foster and Group Homes is as follows:

Foster Home Rate Increase \$339,005
Provide Kinship Care \$3,081,949 (based on approximately \$1,247 children, rates same as Foster Home)
Group Home Increase - \$528,815

Foster Home Rate Comparison to southeast average:

The increases would position South Carolina favorably in comparison with the averages, for each age group, of the southeastern states (Arkansas, Louisiana, Florida, Alabama, South Carolina, Georgia, Virginia, North Carolina, Tennessee and Kentucky). In comparison, at the proposed rates (based on adjusted USDA calculations) below there would be 3 of 10 states lower than SC in the 0-5 age group, 5 of 10 would be lower in the 6-12 year old age group and 5 of 10 states would be lower in the 13 up age group.
