I called to ask that you please investigate DSS vs. LeBret Case No. 2017-DR-30-00441. This is a family in our area who are friends of ours. Ryan and Brie LeBret serve God and their family. They adopted four boys through the South Carolina Department of Social Services and have three biological children, twin boys and a girl. They home school their children and served as Missionaries to children in Nicaragua. They continue to serve children by volunteering at the Church of God

I called your office just a few minutes ago. I met you at Anderson Mill Rd Baptist just last week! I really appreciated your testimony! I called to ask that you please investigate DSS vs. LeBret Case No. 2017-DR-30-00441. This is a family in our area who are friends of ours. Ryan and Brie LeBret serve God and their family. They adopted four boys through the South Carolina Department of Social Services and have three biological children, twin boys and a girl. They home school their children and served as Missionaries to children in Nicaragua. They continue to serve children by volunteering at the Church of God Children's Home in Simpsonville, SC and as teachers and tutors in the home school community. Each of the adopted boys endured severe abuse by their biological parents which was not disclosed by DSS. One of the abused boys, now 17 years old, at the request of the parents was removed from the home by court order in 2015. DSS repeatedly attempted to place the boy back into the home despite the court order and threatened to charge the parents with abandonment. The LeBret's have remained actively engaged in the life and care of the boy despite the fact that he cannot be in the home. The LeBret's engaged an attorney to file a motion on their behalf requesting DSS take custody of the 17 year old in order to keep them from violating a court order and to prevent abandonment charges from being filed. Subsequently DSS filed a bench order to remove all children without cause. On Friday, July 7, 2017 the six children were removed from their custody. The bench order was issued without the initiation of a home evaluation despite repeated requests for visitations and assistance by Ryan and Brie LeBret.
