

"Farm-To-School" Program Announced

Beaufort and Jasper School Districts and Lowcountry Farmers are pioneers in a new program designed to link school districts with local farmers in South Carolina. The program encourages small farms to sell fresh fruits and vegetables to schools and the schools to buy from their local communities. This initiative develops new markets for small farmers, improves the freshness of vegetables available for consumption at schools and may create on-farm educational opportunities for school children.

"The statewide success of this program will depend on these two school districts and the low-country farmers" said Dr. Onunkwo, the Director of the Center for Rural Cooperative Business Development at South Carolina State University (SCSU). "If the enthusiasm among Mr. Ronald Myers (Beaufort Schools), Ms. Lydia Breland (Jasper Schools), and Mr. Joe Frazier and other farmers is an indication, the program will be a success".

The Center is encouraging school districts to develop purchasing agreements with farmers in their regions and has allocated another \$4,000 as an incentive for two other school districts to try this project. "This money can be used by the schools to try buying from small farmers at no cost to them," said Dr. Sureshwaran, Co-Director of the Center. "If they are successful, they can buy more in the future".

Debbie Turbeville, State Cooperative Specialist for USDA Rural Development, first learned about the Farms/School Meals Initiative, popularly called the "farm-to-school" project, developed by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service. This is a successful program in North Carolina with participation from many school districts and farmers.

Soybean Industry Welcomes Oilseed Payment Program Benefits to Farmers

The SC Soybean Board and the SC Soybean Association join the American Soybean Association (ASA) in welcoming the announcement by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) calling for distribution of about \$500 million to the nation's oilseed producers. It is estimated that 77 percent of the funds, or about \$385 million, will be paid to farmers based upon their soybean production.

In 1999, ASA was the lead organization that pressed Congress for a special income assistance program as part of a comprehensive emergency farm assistance package. Congress authorized the special oilseed payment after ASA raised concerns that the Agricultural Marketing Transition Act (AMTA) payments did not reflect soybean prices and income, since AMTA payments are based on former program crop acres and yields. In 2000, ASA again successfully urged Congress to include an oilseed payment program in emergency farm legislation passed by Congress. About 28 percent of U.S. crop area was planted to soybeans last year.

Producers who planted soybeans or other eligible crops in 2000 are eligible to participate in the Oilseed Payment Program. A producer's payment yield for soybeans is based on a county historical average or the producer's actual yield. A producer's payment acres are based on the highest of planted acres in 1997, 1998, or 1999, except for new producers the payment acres are based on 2000 plantings. For example, a farm with 200 acres of soybeans, with a 42 bushel per acre yield, can expect to get about \$1,196.00 from this program at the projected payment rate for soybeans of \$0.1425 per bushel.

State Peanut Yield Award

Each year the South Carolina Peanut Board recognizes the top peanut producers in the state. The Board presents the state champion with a trophy and the district champion with a plaque. The top producers are recognized each year at the South Carolina AG EXPO.

The 2000 State Champion is Delano Kneece and Son Inc./Everette Kneece. Delano, Ricky and Everette Kneece farm in Pelion, South Carolina. Their average yield was 5,549lbs on 194.3 acres. Their total production was 1,078,362 lbs.

The District One Champion is Triple C Farms. Triple C Farms is operated by Samuel, Frances, and Guignard Burrows. The farm is located in Sumter, South Carolina. Their average yield was 4,236lbs on 195.9 acres. Their total production was 829,812 lbs.

South Carolina had the highest average yield in the United States that consisted of 3,000 lbs/acre.

A World of Opportunity in SC

National Agriculture Week, March 18th through the 24th, culminates with National Agriculture Day, which falls on March 20th, the first day of spring. This year's theme, "Sea to Shining Sea...Agriculture is a World of Opportunity" strives to promote jobs in agriculture among school children.

This year's theme stems from an ongoing campaign called "America's Largest Classroom on Agriculture". The program is a nationally coordinated endeavor to teach children about agriculture. Working with groups such as the National FFA, 4-H, and Project Food, Land and People, their hope is that by reaching children they will educate future generations of consumers. This year's Ag Day will focus on jobs in agriculture and teaching children about the many occupations available.

Ag Day has become a huge event, growing by leaps and bounds with over one million participants gaining knowledge about farming and agriculture in the 2000 program, versus 300,000 in 1999. Those that aid the program have grown as well; numbers of volunteers have tripled since the inaugural year.

The website for the organization, agday.org, showcases numerous positions that are available for graduates in the area of agriculture. According to the site, a new study expects annual job openings for U.S. food and agricultural sciences to be around 58,000 this year.

Jobs are not only found on the farm. Today's agriculture offers over 200 careers, ranging from Agribusiness Management and Agricultural and Natural Resources Communications to Horticulture and Forestry.

For example, our marketing department maintains and develops broad-based marketing programs to increase consumer awareness and product demand for quality South Carolina agricultural products at local, national, and international levels. Careers in this area include marketing specialists, who are focused on serving as liaisons to the state's commodity boards for products like beef, cotton, peanuts, pork, soybean, tobacco, and watermelons, to name a few.

The Department of Agriculture also offers careers in consumer services. Staff responsibilities in this area range from protecting citizens of this state from fraud by ensuring net content statements on packages and weighing to making sure that weighing and measuring devices are correct. Staff are also responsible for drawing official samples for the Department's Laboratory Division to ensure the quality of motor fuels, the quality and safety of some food products, and the quality of some agricultural products.

Our very own Market Bulletin staff consists of editors, public information specialists, and administrative assistants that combine their efforts to make the publication an effective and efficient way for farmers to sell surplus items. The public information office not only ensures the quality of the Bulletin, but it is also the heart for various written, verbal, and visual communications to the public and the media.

In addition, the Department of Agriculture includes staff in the laboratory services division with science-based careers who protect consumers from unsafe, ineffective or fraudulent goods. And, staff in the market services division provide commodity inspection programs as well as market news services.

Aside from the public sector, agricultural careers are also offered throughout the state in private enterprise. Jobs are available at food processing companies, industries dealing with biotechnology, and a myriad of other privately owned businesses. In the summer of 2000, Ms. Turbeville organized a meeting for SCSU business faculty with officials at the North Carolina Department of Agriculture and small farm cooperatives participating in this project. Ms. Turbeville was instrumental in initiating this project at St. Helena's Island and including the SC Coastal Community Development Corporation.

The SCSU Center for Rural Cooperative Business Development was established in 1999 with a grant from USDA Rural Development. In the two years of existence, the Center has completed an assessment of the needs of small farm cooperatives, conducted marketing and feasibility studies and organized a conference. In 2001, USDA has provided additional funding to continue their activities and to begin the "farm-to-school" project, high school educational activities, and a project to enhance small-farm cooperatives' access to information through the use of computers. "We have developed a place where small farmers and cooperatives can come and get information and assistance in developing new and strengthening existing cooperatives," said Dr. Onunkwo.
