Located in Summerville, South Carolina, Colonial Dorchester State Historic Site is an archaeological preserve that consists of the ruins of an entire Colonial-era town (est. 1697). A new public archaeology program has been designed to showcase the park's historic and archaeological landscape. The program combines three segments of public archaeology outreach: informative site orientation, artifact identification and processing, and field investigation. Uniquely at Dorchester, all are held in conjunction with each other creating a model for a volunteer-based public archaeology program. In addition, the combination of these stages allows for the casual onlookers or park visitors to not only witness the unearthing of the buried ruins but participate at a hands-on level.
