TO THE STATE BUDGET AND CONTROL BOARD

Gentlemen:

A meeting of the Board has been scheduled for 11:00 A. M., Tuesday, July 11, 1967 in the Conference Room of the Governor's Office.

The following items will constitute the agenda for this meeting.

1. Employees' Salaries

We have reviewed salary lists from all departments for 1967-68. There were a number of instances where proposed salaries involved increases exceeding the general legislative provision for 5%. Each of these has been given particular consideration and in most instances there were circumstances that appeared to justify the proposed compensation for 1967-68. We have given approval to these increases on that basis.

Enclosed is a list of positions in the upper level where proposals included increases beyond 5%. These are being submitted to the Board for its action.

2. Purchase of Plane for Development Board

In the appropriation for the purchase of the plane for the Development Board it appears that the matter of sales tax on the purchase was overlooked and that approximately \$10,000.00 additional would be required to pay the sales tax. Some provision should be made to meet this situation.

3. Investment Counseling Service

Moody's Investors Service has submitted their usual statement in the amount of \$4,500.00 for counseling service for 1967-68. It is customary to pay for this out of the Civil Contingent Fund. Approval is requested.

4. Retirement System

The Board recently approved Tatum Gressette's employing a Finance Officer, a new position, at a salary of \$13,500.00. A transfer from other items appropriated to the Retirement System, amounting to \$3,500.00, can be made leaving \$10,000.00 to be obtained elsewhere.

It is recommended that \$10,000.00 be allocated to this position from the Civil Contingent Fund with the understanding that a deficiency appropriation will be requested of the 1968 General Assembly.

5. Judicial Council

General Merritt is requesting the Board to approve carrying forward from 1966-67 to 1967-68 the sum of \$11,220.00 of the amount appropriated for the Judicial Council. A copy of his memorandum is attached.

6. Department of Education

Mr. Busbee is requesting the Board's approval to proceed with the School Building Program for 1967-68 on a plan calling for the issuance of \$13,000,000.00 of State School Bonds at some appropriate time during the school year. Formal approval will be requested at the time bonds are to be issued. Initial approval at this time will enable the department to advise school districts now of the amount they may expect in State Funds during the year.

Sales Tax on Jet Aircraft

I have asked Mr. Pat Smith for advice on handling the payment of sales tax on the new aircraft since there was not enough money appropriated to cover the purchase of the aircraft and to pay the sales tax amounting to approximately \$20,000.

We concluded that we should apply the extra \$5,000 from the appropriation, as well as any surplus funds from our 1966-67 fiscal budget, toward the payment of this tax bill.

Mr. Smith also suggested that he bring this matter up before the Budget and Control Board for further action.

I will follow the above-suggested course of action unless you have other advice for me.

MEMORANDUM TO THE BUDGET AND CONTROL BOARD:

The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of South Carolina, who is Chairman of the Judicial Council, has requested me, as Secretary to the Council, to convey a request to the Budget and Control Board to carry over to the fiscal year 1967-1968 the sum of \$11,220.00, which sum remains unexpended from the sum of \$11,500.00 appropriated for the Judicial Council under Item 7, Section 67, Part I, of the General Appropriation Act for the fiscal year 1966-1967.

The Judicial Council has been requested by the General Assembly to undertake a thorough study of the Traffic Court system in operation in other states and its application to conditions existing here and our need for modernizing the system for handling traffic violations in the State. The Judicial Council believes that this is a matter of tremendous importance to the State and should be handled by experts. Fortunately, such a group exists and is available. This group is composed of the Director of the Traffic Court Program of the American Bar Association and his staff. They have conducted similar studies in many other states which have proved highly satisfactory and have indicated a willingness to assist us. The transfer of the sum of \$11,220.00 to the fiscal year 1967-1968 is urgently needed to be applied toward the accomplishment of this very important task.

Section 21-273 and 21-274 of the Code of Laws of 1962 as amended by Section 10 of the General Appropriations Bill for the Fiscal Year 1967-68 provides that from the appropriation for School Building Aid there shall first be reserved and set aside such amount as may be necessary to pay principal and interest payments becoming due that year on State School Bonds. In 1967-68 the appropriation amounts to \$13,047,360.00, and the payments due on school bonds currently outstanding amounts to \$12,163,912.50.


The plan for financing the school building program which has been approved by the State Board of Education provides for the issuance of \$13,000,000.00 in State School Bonds in 1967-68. At its scheduled meeting held on June 16, 1967, the Board unanimously adopted a resolution expressing its intention to formally request the Governor and State Treasurer to issue \$13,000,000.00 in State School Bonds in the fiscal year 1967-68, the dates and amounts of each issue to be determined later.

In order that allocations of funds can be made to the school districts needing building funds immediately, it is requested that the Budget and Control Board authorize this department the use of the appropriation in anticipation of the proposed bond issue. This authorization will permit the orderly approval of building projects and the disbursement of funds to the school districts, and will also permit the State Officials responsible for selling the bonds to sell them at the most advantageous time.

Attached hereto is the following financial data supporting this request:

1. State School Building Fund Finance Plan for 1967-68
2. Schedule of debt service payments to be made on State School Bonds in 1967-68
3. Schedule of the amounts required for all districts to have received 90% of entitlement.
