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Just FYI – Each year the two resettlement agencies, World Relief and Lutheran Services, submit abstracts to the State and ORR with a proposed number of refugees to be placed in SC through their agency. Both World Relief and Lutheran have already submitted those numbers for 2016. Below is a summary of their proposals from 2015 and 16. I'm not sure on actual numbers received in 2015, but I could check.

World Relief –

2015 – Proposed receiving 60 refugees with these nationalities – Burmese, Colombians, Congolese, Cubans, Iraqis, Sudanese, and Syrians

2016 - Proposed receiving 120 refugees with these nationalities - Afghan, Bhutanese, Burmese, Congolese, Iraqi, Nepali, Rwandan, and Ukrainian

Lutheran –

2015 – Proposed receiving 175 refugees with these nationalities – Afghani, Burmese, Iraqi, Eritrean, Bhutanese, Somali, Ukrainian, Cuban, Congolese, Syrian

2016 - Proposed receiving 200 refugees with the these nationalities - Afghani, Burmese, Congolese, Eritrean, Iraqi, Somali, Ukrainian, Syrian, Salvadoran, Guatemalan, and Honduran.

Spoke with State Department this morning. Specific to the 15,000 increase, they do not know where those individuals will be placed or what countries they will come from. Those are just approved slots for refugees that make the cut in FY16. Placement decisions don't happen until after the refugee has passed screening and been approved by DHS for entry. In the meantime, State is going to send over some background information on the screening process, and on the specifics of how resettlement functions in states without a State's involvement (i.e., if a state decides not to submit a state plan).

Same – we have not been contacted by State or the Federal Delegation regarding this announcement to increase US acceptance of refugees.

In terms of position –

The Governor's position on this issue is clear – our nation's role in international humanitarian aid is integral to maintaining our national security, promoting international commerce, and maintaining our moral obligation to aid those persecuted for religious or ethnic reasons. However, her first priority as Governor is the safety of our citizens and communities which is why she is so disappointed that the Obama Administration had not yet contacted her office to discuss South Carolina's role in this expanded refugee effort. Further, they have offered no assurances that the vetting process will remain effective under this expanded effort. Such assurances must be given to states if they are to be expected to further open our schools and homes to additional arrivals.
