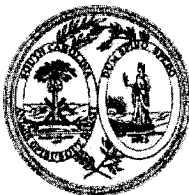

**Re: Parole ending date**


Dear Ms. Gantt:

I have been instructed by our Director Mr. Jerry B. Adger to respond to your March 23, 2016, letter to Governor Haley. Within this letter you expressed displeasure with our office. It is your position that you are currently being supervised on parole longer than you should be. Upon reviewing your records your parole ending date is correct.

According to our records you were convicted of distribution of cocaine second offense. You were given a five year sentence on May 7, 2013. You appeared before the Parole Board on September 21, 2015 and was granted parole. According to South Carolina law "Any prisoner who may be paroled under authority of this chapter shall continue until the expiration of the maximum term or terms specified in his sentence without deduction of such allowance for good conduct as may be provided by law." Therefore, you have to serve the remaining of your five year sentence day for day, which makes your parole scheduled to be completed on February 13, 2018. That time may be deducted to May 13, 2017, due to the possible awarding of compliance credits.
