No, the snake population at Lee is no more or less than any other natural area in the Midlands or Pee Dee of South Carolina. This is a park (a wooded, natural area) so there is a possibility that you could encounter a snake, just like at any other park, but our general advice is if you see one leave it alone and it will leave you alone.

Also, one recommendation I would make if you're coming camping with horses from about mid-May to September is to bring horse fly/yellow fly bug repellent for your horses. Summer brings out the yellow flies which are quite bothersome to horses if they don't have the right bug repellent on.
