Birds of Prey Day

April 2nd, 2016

10am – 11am: Bird Walk
Take a guided walk along the causeway in search of wading birds, waterfowl, eagles, and more. Meet at the causeway parking lot.

10:30am – 12:30pm: Meet the Animals
Join a zookeeper from Brookgreen Gardens to learn about owls and their prey. Meet at the picnic shelter across from the gift shop.

1pm – 2pm: Free-Flight Live Raptor Show
Watch live raptors from the Center for Birds of Prey soar above the flying field as you learn about their unique hunting and flying techniques. Please: NO PETS! Bring a folding chair or blanket to sit on. Meet in the field next to Atalaya.

2pm – 3pm: Owl Pellet Dissection
Explore the contents of a barn owl pellet during this hands-on CSI-style activity; then we will attempt to reconstruct the identity of the prey. Meet at the picnic shelter across from the gift shop.

3pm – 4pm: Children's Nature Crafts
Craft your own pinecone owl to take home! Meet at the picnic shelter across from the gift shop.

8pm: Outdoor Movie: The Messenger
Enjoy this new documentary that explores the plight of our native songbird population, while sitting in the great outdoors. Bring a lawn chair or blanket to sit on. Meet at the beachside of Atalaya.

10am – 5pm: See a real Bald Eagle nest through the spotting scope at the Nature Center!
