RE: South Carolina Biased Decision Makers

This letter serves as a request for the Governor's Office to look into the matter of a couple of South Carolina Magistrate Judge's decision making processes.

As a prose' litigant in several case actions in Charleston, S.C., it has been altogether impossible to gain any fair and unbiased solutions in this District Court area.

Magistrate Judge Robert Carr was the Judge in a case over some years that he ordered dismissed. This case was a slip and fall accident I suffered in Food Lion. The Judge's own relative Patrick Carr was a part of this process as one of the Attorneys opposing me at Turner Padgett, Laney and Graham.

Furthermore, he ordered a Summary Judgment and said the Clerk of Court called me continuously for me to respond to it to bring the case to closure. I was in the hospital at the time receiving 6 pints of blood as an ongoing result of bodily issues from this accident.

My suit was 1.2 million and I was awaiting a jury trial that never did come forth. My health was much more important and I did not have an option of bleeding to death to continue in a fight against a biased decision maker. A Food Lion representative came for mediation, nothing was agreed upon, due to the fact that the mediator wanted me to sign paperwork to make Food Lion my power of attorney for the income.

So I opted for a jury trial instead, which never did take place. Every time I try to defend my rights in the state of South Carolina, I seem to have a very hard time finding any little bit of justice. This is in the face of all the pertinent evidence.

In addition, Magistrate Judge Wallace Dixon another of South Carolina biased decision makers, has sided with Attorney Margaret Horn and Geico Claims Department in a scheme to commit Insurance Fraud at my expense.

An auto accident that I was in that was clearly, by evidence the fault of the driver that hit the car I was in as a passenger. The Judge dismissed the case, because I found the evidence showing that they are in a scheme to commit Insurance Fraud. It is plain and clear.

I made this information known to the Attorney General's Office, to Congress and the Justice Department.

I am in receipt of 1.2 million dollars from Food Lion that someone in Turner Padgett, Laney and Graham has information about, along with Judge Robert Carr and his son Patrick Carr one of the Attorneys for this law firm at the time of my case.

I have sent the proof on the subject of Insurance Fraud by Magistrate Judge Wallace Dixon and Attorney Margaret Horn along with the Geico representatives.

Enclosed are documents for your review to corroborate what I am sharing. These are many of the things that fully take away from the economy of the state of South Carolina.

If an Insurance Company such as Geico is allowed to dismiss a known injury case with the proof of fault and injury, then create a mock case to collect money in the background, this is Insurance Fraud, and it is tearing up the economy of South Carolina.

Should they continue to practice insurance in the state when they take so much more than they give? Are they above the law to practice insurance fraud because Attorneys and Judges aid in the process?

It is creating astronomical medical bills, when you get someone to settle for much of nothing, then make them responsible for medical bills, they did not incur of their own fault. This is what the insurance is for, to cover the liability.

When people cannot pick up their lives from being so heavily oppressed, they are looked upon as taking away from the system and not contributing. But in all actuality, it is those who have oppressed for greed that cause much of the problems.

So this is my plea to this Office and Leader to in fact help in this matter, that I may recover all that was stolen from me. Incidentally, I am quite sure, this is the story for so many South Carolinians as well.

I have had 3 blood transfusions, after these accidents. I have had stroke like symptoms and have threatened a heart attack, suffered injury to both hips and my back while privileged people continue to tear up lives. I am only one of so many in South Carolina that have been plagued by gross injustices.

Who can begin to tell you what has happened to my family as a result of injuries that I did not place upon myself and should not have to suffer for as long as I have.

My plight is to continue until something is done.
