The regular monthly meeting of the Department of Transportation Commission was held at the headquarters building in Columbia, South Carolina at 2:00 p.m. In compliance with the Freedom of Information Act, the news media was advised in writing of the time, date and place of this meeting.

SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of September 7, 2006; copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the sale of surplus right of way property, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise, select and negotiate with professional consulting firms to provide various services, including design, right of way acquisitions, construction engineering and inspection or other associated services, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a firm to provide operation and maintenance of the toll facility at the Cross Island Parkway at Hilton Head Island, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering services to assist the SCDOT with the development of the I-26 improvements from exit 213 to exit 218, as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 6: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing bituminous contracts to include additional resurfacing work as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 7: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 8: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department related to roads in the State Highway Secondary System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 9: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in adding a road in Horry County to the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix. This addition is approved contingent upon the county agreeing to remove like mileage from the System based on the policy of the SCDOT.

SECTION 10: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department concerning projects in the highway letting of September 12, 2006, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 11: On motion of Commissioner Carnell, seconded by Commissioner Atkins, the Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to award and execute a contract to the low bidder for the Palmetto Parkway, Phase II project, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 12: Commissioner Jones reported for the Invitations and Resolutions Committee and noted that the endorsement letter requested by the Commission from the Director of Public Safety at the September meeting for approval of the following request, has been received by the Department. The request is therefore approved, as shown in detail in the Appendix:

- Request from the South Carolina Highway Patrol Colonel Russell F. Roark, III to name the interchange at US 17 and US 21 known as Gardens Corner or a portion of US 17 between Gardens Corner and the Combahee River the "Trooper David Hunter O'Brien Highway"

SECTION 13: Commissioner Carnell reported for the Legislative Committee. At the July 27, 2006 meeting of the Commission, the Commission authorized the Department to prepare a resolution to the legislature asking that the SCDOT funding situation be pursued in 2007. The Legislative Committee approved the resolution as prepared by the Department. Commissioner Carnell made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Atkins, to have Commissioners sign the resolution before being forwarded to the Legislature. The Commission approved the motion by a vote of four to one.

SECTION 14: Commissioner Stevenson reported for the Mass Transit Committee and made a motion requesting Commission approval of the following committee recommendations:

- \$40,000 in State Mass Transit Funds to Anderson County to conduct a study for the expansion and integration of transit for residents along SC Highway 81 Corridor and in the Tri-County Area.
- \$100,000 in Federal Rural Transit Funds to Lowcountry Regional Transportation Authority for the Allendale County Scooter and the Bamberg County Community Transportation.
- \$10,320 in Federal Elderly and Persons with Disabilities funds to Jasper County Council on Aging to continue to provide services through June 30, 2007.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Carnell and passed unanimously.

SECTION 15: Commissioner Carnell reported that the Finance Committee met and had discussion of financial matters but no recommendations came out of the meeting.

SECTION 16: On motion of Commissioner Carnell, seconded by Commissioner Atkins, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to go into Executive Session.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Commission went into Executive Session at 4:50 p.m. for the purpose of discussing the personnel matters.

OPEN SESSION

The Commission returned to Open Session at 6:25 p.m. Chairman Hooper reported that discussion was held but no action was taken in Executive Session.

SECTION 17: There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 6:40 p.m.

Surplus Property Public Notice

October 19, 2006

In accordance with the State of South Carolina Statue 57-5-340, by this publication the Department is making public the Surplus Property Real Estate Transactions to the State Highway Commission. The following sheets include a breakdown of surplus property real estate transactions. These transactions may have resulted from negotiations with property owners during right of way acquisition, direct sales, settlement of a condemnation action, and/or corrective actions to previously reported sales.

1. File 19.497 / MSC 314 / Road S-491 / Edgefield County / Third District

The Department acquired land to construct a maintenance operations facility, MSC 314, near Sweetwater, South Carolina in Edgefield County, from Patricia S. Bedenbaugh, Patricia B. Durham, Stephen T. Bedenbaugh, Clyde R. Jackson, James Hall, Robert H. Tidwell, Mike Woosley, Inc., Abby Prince-a Partnership known as Bedenbaugh Partnership by Title to Real Estate dated January 15, 1993 and by corrective deed dated September 3, 1993.

This maintenance site was declared surplus by the Department and District Engineer Phillip M. Brooks. An appraisal was ordered and sent to the South Carolina Budget and Control Board, which approved the value and gave concurrence for this property to be sold. In the Department's efforts to liquidate its surplus inventory, the subject parcel was marketed to the public with the Grantee making an offer above the appraised price. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 4.97 acres of land to Steven L. Peters and Murray Penner was executed on August 24, 2006, in consideration of \$216,000.00.

2. File 23.650 / US Route 29 / Greenville County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on US Route 29, under Project Number F.A. 242-A in Greenville County, near the City of Greer, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 29, by Condemnation from the Estate of B. F. Flynn dated August 17, 1938.

A request was received from Mr. Robert D. Garrett's State Representative, Senator David Thomas, asking the Department to reduce the right of way on US Route 29 in order to clear an encroachment. The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.42 of an acre of land to Robert D. Garrett was executed on July 11, 2006, in consideration of \$99,500.00.

3. File 23.245A / Route I-85 / Greenville County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on Road S-226 in Greenville County, near the City of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-226 under the Beltline Act on December 1, 1941.

A request was made by C. Douglas Hayes for one half of the abandoned right of way for Road S-226 (Lenhardt Road). The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if the abandoned right of way could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that this parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.05 of an acre of land to C. Douglas Hayes was executed on August 4, 2006.

4. File 37.491 / SC Route 271 / Oconee County / Third District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 271, under File 37.491 in Oconee County, near the City of Walhalla, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 271, by Right of Way Easement from Raymond R. Head and Maude K. Head dated March 6, 1967.

A request was received from the adjacent property owner asking the Department to reduce the right of way on SC Route 271 (now SC Route 11) in front of their property in order to clear an existing building encroachment recently discovered by a surveyor. The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Further research showed a propane tank also encroaching in the right of way. The Grantee agreed to remove the propane tank from the right of way prior to the execution of this deed as a condition of the sale. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.01 of an acre of land to Charles & Melinda L. Harper was executed on August 8, 2006, in consideration of \$1,000.00.

5. File 21.103B / Road S-24 Relocation / Florence County / Sixth District

During construction of improvements on Route 305 (now Road S-24), under File 21.266 in Florence County, near the City of Florence, the Department acquired right of way for Route 305 (now Road S-24), by Deed to Right of Way from Mae Rensfeld and Mack Johnson dated September 6, 1947.

A request was received from the adjacent owner asking the Department to sell a small portion of old Road S-24 made surplus by the relocation of Road S-24. The request was circulated to engineering sections to determine if said parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.71 of an acre of land to Big John Calcutt, Jr. was executed on August 8, 2006, in consideration of \$8,500.00.

6. File 10.257A / 10.432A / US Route 17 / Charleston County / First District

During construction of improvements on US Route 17 under File 10.432A, in the City of Charleston in Charleston County, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 17 by Title to Real Estate from St. Matthews Baptist Church dated January 3, 2002.

Whereas, during negotiations on the new Cooper River Bridge Project, several tracts owned by the Greater Refuge Church were needed as right of way. An agreement was reached whereby the Department would grant to the said Greater Refuge Church an Option to purchase other property owned by SCDOT (known as the St. Matthews Baptist Church) for the price of \$750,000.00. The Greater Refuge Church is now exercising its Option to purchase the property (known as St. Matthews Baptist Church) for the said agreed upon price. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for 1.20 acres of land to the Greater Refuge Church of Our Lord Jesus Christ of the Apostolic Faith, Inc. was executed on August 4, 2006, in consideration of \$750,000.00.

7. File 1.527 / SC Route 72 / Abbeville County / Third District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 72, under File No. 1.212, Project No. F.A.G.M-15A (1) in Abbeville County, in the City of Abbeville, the Department acquired right of way for a portion of Brooks Street by Deed to Right of Way from William P. Greene, Jr. dated August 24, 1939.

SCDOT did not add this portion of Brooks Street to the Highway System and never maintained the road. Brooks Street has been closed to traffic under File No. 1.527, SC Route 72. A request was received from Resident Maintenance Engineer Randy Day to have a Quitclaim Deed prepared to convey any interest that SCDOT may have in the above-mentioned parcel to the Grantee. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.14 of an acre of land to Brooks Street Properties, LLC was executed on August 28, 2006, in consideration of \$1,000.00.

8. File 23.481/42.136B / SC Route 14 / Greenville / Spartanburg County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 14, under file 23.481A/42.136B in Spartanburg County, near the City of Greer, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 14, by Condemnation from W. J. Leonard and Dorothy G. Leonard dated February 4, 2002.

A request was received by the Department from the Grantee asking to exchange some right of way at the intersection of SC Route 14 and Westmoreland Drive. The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if said parcels could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that the parcels were surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.16 of an acre of land to SRMC Ventures, LLC was executed on August 28, 2006, in consideration of \$20,500.00.

9. File 1244.100B / SC Route 72/121/215 / Chester County / Fifth District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 72/121/215, under File 1244.100B in Chester County, near the City of Chester, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 72/121/215, by Title to Real Estate from Robert D. Walker dated May 18, 2005.

Under Project 1244.100B the Department was acquiring right of way for a new construction project. During investigation it was discovered that a Revolutionary War Battle took place at Fish Dam Ford, which is this location. It was decided to purchase the entire 143.15-acre tract to preserve the Revolutionary war site. The Department has agreed to deed this tract to South Carolina Department of Natural Resources for environmental mitigation purposes to hold in trust. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 138.42 acres of land to South Carolina Department of Natural Resources was executed on August 28, 2006.

10. File 1.527 / SC Route 72 / Abbeville County / Third District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 72, under File No. 1.212, Project No. F.A.G.M. 15-A (1) in Abbeville County, in the City of Abbeville, the Department acquired right of way for a portion of Brooks Street by Deed to Right of Way from William P. Greene, dated August 24, 1939, and by Deed to Right of Way from Abbeville Mills dated September 6, 1939. Also, under File No. 124.211.2, the Department acquired right of way for a portion of SC Route 72 by Title to Real Estate from William P. Greene, Jr. dated October 8, 1949, and by Deed to Right of Way from Abbeville Public School District No. 22 dated September 30, 1949.

SCDOT did not add this portion of Brooks Street to the Highway System and never maintained the road, and it has been closed to traffic under File No. 1.527, SC Route 72. A request was received from DEA Phillip M. Brooks to have a Quitclaim Deed prepared to convey any interest that SCDOT may have in the above-mentioned remainder of Brooks Street and excess right of way along SC Route 72 in this area to the City of Abbeville. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.62 of an acre of land to the City of Abbeville was executed on August 24, 2006.

11. File 23.188A / US Route 25 / Greenville County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 247, under Project Number 712-A Reop., near Ware Place in Greenville County, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 247 from G. T. Ware by Condemnation dated November 26, 1929, from O. R. Ware and G. T. Ware by Condemnation dated November 26, 1929, from I.P. Jordan by Deed to Right of Way dated October 11, 1929; also during construction on improvements on SC Route 8, under FAS Project Number 43-A, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 8 from Miss Addie Jordan, Miss Cary Sue Jordan, and The First National Bank of Greenville, SC, as Committee for Miss Cary Sue Jordan by Condemnation dated March 23 1938, from O. R. Ware by Condemnation dated March 23, 1938; also during construction of improvement on SC Route 8, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 8 under the Beltline Act; also during construction of improvements on US Route 25, under File 23.188A, the Department acquired right of way for US Route 25 from David R. Boyd by Title to Real Estate dated March 15, 1991.

The intersection of US Route 25, SC Route 8, and SC Route 247 was realigned under File 23.188A.1 leaving an area of old abandoned sections of SC Route 8 and SC Route 247. A request was received asking the Department to relinquish an abandoned portion of SC Route 247 and SC Route 8. The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for 2.06 acres of land to Hidden Hills of Glassy Mountain, LLC was executed on September 12, 2006, in consideration of \$150,000.00.

12. File 4.258 / SC Route 88 / Anderson County / Third District

During construction of improvements on SC Route 88, under File 4.258 in Anderson County, near the Town of Pendleton, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 88 and US Route 178 by Deed to Right of Way from Mrs. Grayton J. Rankin and Lawrence Lenhardt dated May 12, 1941.

A request was received from the adjacent owner through DEA Busbee asking the Department to sell a small portion of excess right of way near the intersection of SC Route 88 and US Route 178. The request was circulated to the engineering sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. After review, it was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.19 of an acre of land to Patrick B. O'Dell and Caroline M. O'Dell was executed on September 14, 2006, in consideration of \$1,725.00.

13. File 23.977 / Route I-85 / Greenville County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on Route I-85, under File 23.977 in Greenville County, near the City of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for Route I-85, by Title to Real Estate from James W. Bridges & Betty G. Bridges dated January 15, 1992.

In the Department's efforts to liquidate its surplus inventory, the subject parcel was given to a real estate consultant to sell. This very small uneconomic parcel of land was offered to the adjacent property owners with the Grantee making a request to purchase. Therefore, a Quitclaim Deed for 0.36 of an acre of land to Walter Panagakos was executed on August 28, 2006, in consideration of \$17,500.00.

14. File 42.199B / Route I-85 / Spartanburg County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on Aviation Avenue and I-85, under File No. 42.199B, in Spartanburg County, near the City of Greer, the Department acquired right of way for Aviation Avenue and I-85 from Greenville-Spartanburg Airport District by a Gratis Title to Real Estate dated July 26, 2004, the understanding that any property not used in construction would be returned to the Grantee.

This is a Design/Built Project in which changes were made causing this parcel to be surplus and not needed during construction. A request was received from District Right of Way Administrator Dennis Hardwick to have a Quitclaim Deed prepared to convey any interest that SCDOT may have in the above-mentioned right of way to Greenville-Spartanburg Airport District. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 5.47 acres of land to the Greenville-Spartanburg Airport District was executed on September 14, 2006.

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15. File 23.918 / Road S-183 / Greenville County / Fourth District

During construction of improvements on Road S-183, under File 23.918 in Greenville County, near the City of Greenville, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-183, by Title to Real Estate from William T. Adams, Jr. dated April 26, 1985.

During negotiations for right of way on Road S-183, the Department promised the remainder of Tract 6A to the adjacent landowner for credit towards new right of way that was needed. Prior to a quitclaim deed being issued to Wilbert Burial Vault Company, Inc., they sold his property to the Grantee who is requesting the parcel. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.15 of an acre of land to Transitions Real Estate Development Company, LLC was executed on September 28, 2006.

Professional Services Recommendations

The following sheets include recommendations for the Department to utilize professional consulting firms to provide various services, which may include design, right of way acquisitions, construction engineering and inspection, or other associated services. The Department requests approval from the Commission to advertise, select and negotiate for these necessary services.

Recommendations – October 19, 2006

Cross Island Parkway – Operation and Maintenance

The SCDOT request Commission approval to advertise and select a firm to provide operation and maintenance of the toll facility at the Cross Island Parkway at Hilton Head Island, SC.

The current ten (10) year contract with ACS State and Local Solutions, Inc. ends in February 2008. In order to advertise, negotiate, select and possibly transition a firm for this complex project, the Department anticipates a minimum of fourteen (14) months.

**REQUEST FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE I-26
IMPROVEMENTS NEAR THE PROPOSED PORT ACCESS ROAD
CHARESTON COUNTY
(COMMISSION DISTRICT 6)**

The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) requests Commission approval to advertise and select a consulting firm for the purpose of providing engineering services to assist the SCDOT with the development of the I-26 improvements from Exit 213 to Exit 218 near the proposed new marine container terminal. The scope of services will consist of preconstruction planning and management, preliminary design, and environmental documentation for an estimated cost of \$1,168,108. Based on current and projected workloads, the Department does not have sufficient staff to proceed with developing this project within the required time frame.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 0

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of 41 roads in this project.

BEAUFORT COUNTY: (Commissioner John N. Hardee)

Contract of Roadscape North Florida, Inc. – File No. 7.200601 – extended to include pavement markings (File No. 7.200601) on S-67, S-69, S-100, S-107, S-110, S-151, S-153, S-202, S-524, S-595, S-672, S-769, S-782 and S-900 for 8.34 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 0

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of 45 roads in this project.

Contract of Banks Construction Company, Inc. – File No. 8.7205.01 & 18.7205.01 – extended to include full depth patching (File No. 8.7205.01) on S-35 (Berkeley County) and S-58 (Dorchester County) for 7.22 miles, and chip seal on S-448 and S-360 (Berkeley County) and S-371 (Dorchester County) for 6.10 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 0

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of 15 roads in this project.

Commissioner Marvin Stevenson)

Contract of Roadscope North Florida, Inc. – File No. 10.200601 – extended to include pavement markings (File No. 7.200601) on US 52/78, US 52 and US 78 for 8.27 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 0

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of 9 roads in this project.

DORCHESTER COUNTY:

Contract of Roadscope North Florida, Inc. – File No. 18.200601 – extended to include pavement markings (File No. 7.200601) on S-58 from S-22 to S-13 for 4.15 miles and S-630 from US 78 to S-233 for 1.45 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 0

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of 13 roads in this project.

SUMTER COUNTY:

Contract of The Miller Group, Inc. – File No. 43.7205.01 – extended to include chip seal (File 43.7205.01) on S-12, S-105, S-106, S-278, S-282, S-303, S-340, S-461, S-478, S-802, S-1018 and S-1019 for 23.73 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of an underrun due to the deletion of 7 roads in this project.

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.

EXTENSION OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work as follows:

CHEROKEE & CHESTERFIELD COUNTY: (Commissioner Bobby Jones)

Contract of Oglesby Construction, Inc. – File No. 11.148B & 13.138B – extended to include additional sections of State Project CRS-CR11 & CRS-CR13 (File No. 4753.134B & 4754.133B) consisting of thermoplastic and pavement markings on S-31 (Cherokee County) and S-22 (Chesterfield County).

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 83,084.00

This extension is being requested in order to take advantage of Crash Reduction by Improving Safety on Secondaries (CRISOS) funding to reduce the occurrence of accidents along these roadways.

FLORENCE COUNTY: (Commissioner Bobby Jones)

Contract of APAC-Atlantic, Inc. – File No. 21.2005 – extended to include an additional section of State Project SMP-SMP5 (File No. 21.2005) consisting of resurfacing on S-473 (Parker Drive).

Estimated Cost of Extension \$130,865.43

The Florence County Transportation Committee has funded this extension.

HAMPTON COUNTY: (Commissioner John N. Hardee)

Contract of Eagle Construction Company, Inc. – File No. 25.107C – extended to include an additional section of State Project C-107C (File 3.105C) consisting of road improvements on S-31.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 78,902.50

The Hampton County Transportation Committee has funded this extension.

SUMTER COUNTY: (Commissioner Bobby Jones)

Estimated Cost of Extension \$120,027.35

The Sumter County Transportation Committee has funded this extension.

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.

Removal of Roads From State Highway Secondary System

The Department recommends Commission approval for the removal of certain sections of secondary roads from the State Highway Secondary System. These sections of roads may be removed for one of the following reasons:

1. Abandonment of Relocated Section of Highway
2. Deletions and Removal of Roads from State Secondary System - Roads may be deleted and removed from secondary system by exchanging for equal or less mileage or roads, which have a higher traffic importance. Ownership reverts to local government having jurisdiction (city or county). Approval of deletion or removal by local government is not required.
3. Abandonment of Right-of-way - Right-of-way may be abandoned if it is determined that the right-of-way is not required for right-of-way proposes or if the right-of-way is not needed for Department purposes.
4. Court Order

Correction of Description of State Highways

The Department recommends Commission approval of the correction of the description of sections of State Highway previously added to the State Highway System. The description of roads currently in the State Highway Secondary System may be changed for relocation purposes, to revise the description of the termini to show what was actually constructed by contract, county line changes, or a change in the secondary road number.

Additions to State Highway Secondary System

The Department recommends Commission approval to add sections of road to the State Highway Secondary System for construction and maintenance. The Department may add roads to the State Highway Secondary System by request of the County Transportation Committees contingent on mileage being available under the current mileage cap. Roads may be added to the State Secondary System by the construction of a new roadway, accepting existing county/city roads into our Secondary System by the swap method, or by county line changes. Roads added to the State Highway System must be constructed to Department standards or reviewed for compliance with Department standards.

Rescind Action Adding Roads to State Highway Secondary System

The Department recommends the Commission rescind its previous actions adding roads to the State Highway Secondary System for construction and maintenance. The Department may rescind action on roads, which have not been constructed and formally accepted into the State Highway Secondary System. Roads may be rescinded due to right-of-way being unavailable, problems arising during construction, or funding issues.

Transfer of Road between Secondary and Primary Systems

The Department recommends Commission approval to transfer sections of road from the Secondary System to the Primary System, or vice versa. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 57-5-50 of the Code-of-Laws of South Carolina, 1976, the Commission may transfer any route or section of route from the state highway secondary system to the state highway primary system, or vice versa, when, in its judgment, such transfer is advisable to better serve the traveling public.

Detailed information concerning each of these requests is attached.
