Fairly certain someone shot at my wife in her car with a bb or pellet gun earlier today, while driving toward King's Mountain State Park today. She was northbound on Hwy 161, past Bethany, SC, 2 to 3 minutes before turning on to Park Road into the Park. She thought it was a heavy rock, but the closest vehicle ahead of her was a quarter mile or so ahead, and she neither saw a rock coming towards her window nor exiting away from it. Attached are pictures of the front of the car, and a close up of the damage. You'll notice the imprint of the strike is perfectly where her face was. Almost too perfect to be a coincidence. Fortunately the hit did not penetrate the glass. It did come close. We have also asked the insurance company to assess and make a judgement as to cause given they replace glass daily and see all varieties of glass damage. Tomorrow, I intend to report this to law enforcement during regular hours. Not being from your area, I'm not sure if it is city or county I should report this to, but will probably connect with all. I would ask that you share this with the Kings Mtn Rangers, and ask them to be aware, notify the public as needed, and respond to us if they are aware of any similar occurrences, recently or in the past.
