**Subject:** Impact to SLED

Hello Lanneau!

We now have some hard numbers for you about what kind of impact would be caused to SLED-due to having to process our background checks.

(Christian, I am copying you in case it may be useful in your conversations).

SLED processes 9,000-12,000 *applicant* background checks **per month**. National Service applicants in SC, would request at maximum, 710 checks **the first year**. (Since SeniorCorps checks are only required one time, the number of potential check requests would drop to about 600 checks after the first year).

\*The number of background checks processed by SLED per month is actually higher, because the applicant back ground check number (9-12k) does not include criminal back ground checks processed.

So just taking into account the average number of *applicant* back ground checks processed **per year**-the National Service Background checks would result in a .6% workload increase.
