SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of February 10, 2000, copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the sale of surplus right of way property - land, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise, select and negotiate with a consulting engineering firm experienced in all phases of underwater bridge inspection, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in removing a section of road in Colleton County from the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 6: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in removing sections of roads in Horry County from the State Highway Secondary System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 7: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in adding a section of road in Fairfield County to the State Highway System.

SECTION 8: On behalf of the members of the Commission, Chairman Martin presented resolutions to former Commissioners Arnold S. Goodstein, Bobby T. Jones and W. M. "Mat" Self, in recognition of their dedicated service to the Department and the State. Copies of the resolution are shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 9: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion adopting a resolution naming the interchange at US 76/378 and Interstate 77 the "Heyward McDonald Interchange", as shown in the Appendix.

SECTION 10: On behalf of the members of the Commission, Chairman Martin presented resolutions commending employees Lynn Martin, Josh Upchurch and Tommy Johnson for bravery above and beyond the call of duty. Copies of the resolutions are shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 11: On behalf of the members of the Commission, Chairman Martin presented a resolution to Executive Director Mabry commending the employees of the Department for outstanding effort and a job well done in keeping the state's highways open and safe and for informing the traveling public about road conditions during the winter snow storm of 2000. A copy of the resolution, which is shown in detail in the Appendix, will be displayed in each district office.

SECTION 12: On motion of Commissioner Atkins, seconded by Commissioner Harrell, the Commission unanimously passed a motion adopting a Concurrent Resolution to name the portion of Highway 221 between Highway 176 and Interstate 85 in Spartanburg County as "David Pearson Boulevard", as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 13: On motion of Commissioner Truluck, seconded by Commissioner Atkins, the Commission unanimously passed a motion commending Department employees for their hard work and dedication during the flood in Horry County.

SECTION 14: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to have a resolution prepared to be presented at the next meeting of the Commission to the family of Valentine Burroughs.

SECTION 15: There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 12:10 p.m.

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## SURPLUS RIGHT OF WAY PROPERTY - LAND

1. File 37.692 - Road S-637 - Oconee County

During construction of improvements on Road S-637, under File 37.692 in Oconee County, near the Town of Westminister, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-637, by Letter of Dedication from the Town of Westminister dated July 15, 1975.

During improvements to Road S-637, at the request of the Town of Westminister Road S-637 was relocated by the Department. An inquiry was circulated to the Engineering Sections who determined that the old road bed of S-637 was surplus to Department needs and the land should be returned back to the Town of Westminister. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.40 of an acre of land was executed to the Town of Westminister, on January 27, 2000.

2. File 32.308 - Road S-24 (Main Street) - Lexington County

During construction of improvements on Road S-24 (Main Street), under File 32.308 in Lexington County, near the Town of Gilbert, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-24 (Main Street), by Letter of Dedication from the Town of Gilbert dated March 27, 1950.

At the request of the Town of Gilbert, to reduce the right of way on Main Street from 130' to 100', a request was circulated to the Engineering Sections to determine if the right of way could be reduced and declared surplus. After review it was determined that the right of way could be reduced and the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.07 of an acre of land to the Town of Gilbert was executed on January 27, 2000.

3. File 21.157A - Road S-1033 - Florence County

During construction of improvements on Road S-1033 in Florence County, near the Town of Florence, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-1033 from Dorothy B. Motte (Mother of Grantee) by dedication under File 21.598 dated September 13, 1966 as recorded in Plat Book W at page 151.

At the request of the adjacent owner, a request was circulated to the Engineering Sections to determine if said parcel could be declared surplus. After review it was determined that the parcel was surplus to Department needs. Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.18 acres of land to Patricia McKinzie Blackmon was executed on January 27, 2000.

4. File 4.150 - SC Route 81 - Anderson County

During construction of improvements on SC Route 81, under File 4.150A in Anderson County, near the Town of Starr, the Department acquired right of way for SC Route 81, by Title to Real Estate from Albert Stevenson dated November 9, 1999.

During negotiations for new right of way on SC Route 81 from West Carolina Rural Telephone and Cooperative, Inc., it was decided that the Department would deed a portion of the adjacent property already acquired by SCDOT to the above party in exchange for new right of way needed on the SC Route 81 Project.

Therefore, a Gratis Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.03 acres of land to West Carolina Rural Telephone & Cooperative, Inc. was executed on February 3, 2000.

5. File 10.134A - Road S-1326 - Charleston County

During construction of improvements on Road S-1326 and Road S-2527, under File 10.134A in Charleston County, near the Town of Mt. Pleasant, the Department acquired right of way for Road S-2527, by Title to Real Estate from Addco Mining Co. dated November 16, 1988.

At the request of the adjacent owner to purchase a strip of right of way on Road S-1326, a request was circulated to the Engineering Sections to determine if the parcel was surplus. After review it was determined that the parcel was surplus to the Departments needs. Therefore a Quitclaim Deed for approximately 0.27 acres of land to J. Paul Taylor, in consideration of \$5,610.00 was executed on November 18, 1999.

This matter is reported to the Commission in accordance with the requirements of Code Section 57-5-340.

## **Underwater Bridge Inspection Project No. 13**

The Department's Bridge Maintenance Office seeks approval to advertise, select, and negotiate with a Consulting Engineering Firm experienced in all phases of underwater bridge inspection. This is a required inspection process for certain bridges under the FHWA National Bridge Inspection Standards (**NBIS**). The cost of these inspections is estimated at \$500,000 and will be paid out of Federal Aid Bridge Funds.

The Department does not have all the resources to perform this type work so the use of a Consulting Engineering Firm is justified.

**EXTENSION OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS**

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as follows:

**CHARLESTON COUNTY:**

Contract of Banks Construction Company, Inc. - File 10.442A - extended to include an additional section of Project FAP IM-5264(177) (File No. 10.442A) to include emergency crossover ramps on I-26.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 69,726.00

Contract of Banks Construction Company - File No. 10.51991 - extended to include resurfacing (File No. 7.639) with asphalt concrete surfacing, paint, bituminous curb, milling existing asphalt, and pavement markings on US 17 bridge ends over Lockwood Boulevard in the City of Charleston.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$143,572.00

**LEXINGTON COUNTY:**

Contract of C. R. Jackson, Inc. - File No. 32.21991 - extended to include widening (File No. 40.395A) grading, drainage, paint and resurfacing with asphalt concrete surfacing on a section of SC 6 in the Red Bank area of Lexington County.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 81,659.93

**GREENWOOD COUNTY:**

Contract of Eagle Construction Company, Inc. - File No. 24.762 - extended to include an additional section of Project FAP BRT-0035(131) (File No. 24.762) consisting of the reconstruction of a two-block section of US 25 Business in the town of Ware Shoals.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 83,567.80

**YORK COUNTY:**

Contract of Blythe Construction, Inc. - File No. 46.633A - extended to include resurfacing (File No. 46.80991) with asphalt concrete surfacing on S-1614 for 0.700 mile.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 25,064.80

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.

**AND WHEREAS**, Mr. Upchurch and Ms. Martin are both former volunteer firefighters, and their training helped them in this emergency situation;

**AND WHEREAS**, Mr. Upchurch and Ms. Martin are deserving of the thanks and the highest recognition of the South Carolina Department of Transportation and the State of South Carolina, and exemplify the true meaning of the RIGHT TEAM values;
