TIDBIT TUESDAY! It's sea turtle nesting season on South Carolina beaches! A female loggerhead sea turtle weighs about 300-400 pounds and is 25-30 years old before she is able to lay her first clutch of eggs. Female loggerhead turtles typically come onshore at night to lay their clutches of eggs. They will lay approximately 120 eggs in a nest chamber that resembles an inverted light bulb. The eggs incubate for about two months before hatching. Due to predation, pollution and other casualties (such as boat strikes), only about 1 in 1,000 hatchlings becomes an adult.
