The Budget Commission met in the Governor's Office at 11:00 o'clock A. M. All members of the Commission were present.

The following transfers of 1943-44 appropriations were approved by the Commission:

Clemson Agricultural College

Item 5. Tobacco Research Work \$960.00 - To H-2 "Construction of Tenant House on Tobacco Farm"

Department of Labor

Office Supplies \$100.00 - To "Repairs"

Fair Exhibits \$160.00 - To "Motor Vehicle Supplies."

The following allotments were granted from the Civil Contingent

Fund:

State Schoolbook Commission

Extra Clerical Help \$605.00

Manufacturers' Record - To sponsor a South Carolina edition, to cover the cost of four pages of advertising therein \$1,000.00.

The following allotment was granted from the Contingent Fund for National Defense:

An advance of \$10,000.00 to the Department of Education, Vocational Rehabilitation Division - these funds to be returned from Federal moneys which were due the department.

Mr. H. M. McElveen, of the State Board of Health, appeared before the Commission and requested an allotment of approximately \$4700.00 from the Contingent Fund for National Defense, to reimburse the Federal Government for expenditures for trucks and cars, which expenditures had been disapproved by the Federal Government as not permissible under the Lanham Act. The Commission deferred action on this request, and asked

that the Federal Government be urged to allow these expenditures; and instructed Mr. McElveen to report later to the Commission on the matter.

The Commission then adjourned.
