Tom Davis, a Beaufort Republican, told his colleagues Wednesday that he is convinced the Senate will not pass meaningful reform of the state Department of Transportation this year, something he asked for last year in his successful filibuster.

Note: Gov. Nikki Haley has asked for the current system to be scrapped. The House passed a roads bill last year that gives the governor the authority to appoint the highway commissioners.
