This week, Governor Jindal attended multiple get out the vote rallies for Congressman Bill Cassidy and criticized Senator Landrieu for being a supporter of the Obama agenda and not representing Louisiana values. The Governor also condemned the Obama Administration for imposing another EPA regulation that will destroy good-paying American jobs.

Here Is A Quick Recap Of The News About The Governor's Week:

Governor Jindal **Blasted Mary Landrieu For Voting Against Our Second Amendment Rights At A Bill Cassidy Get Out The Vote Rally.** "Does Mary Landrieu represent Louisiana values?" Gov. Bobby Jindal asked on multiple occasions. Each time, he was greeted with a resounding, "No!" The governor was joined by Sen. Marco Rubio at a Republican unity rally for Dr. Bill Cassidy

in Kenner, LA. Cassidy is challenging Sen. Mary Landrieu for a seat in the United States Senate. "The eyes of the country are on Louisiana," Jindal said. ... Perhaps noticing the sea of orange NRA hats, Jindal attacked Landrieu's gun rights record and President Obama's insulting 'guns and religion' hot mic comment from 2008. "Mary Landrieu has voted against our Second Amendment rights, she has voted to confirm a radical, anti-gun justice of the Supreme Court, she has a 'D' rating from the NRA. Does Mary Landrieu represent our values?"

Governor Jindal Criticized The Obama Administration As "Science Deniers" For Imposing Another EPA Rule That Will Kill Jobs. Governor Jindal said, "President Obama's new environmental regulations are reckless and based on a radical leftist ideology that will kill American jobs and increase energy prices. Under the President's proposed new plan, Louisiana's metro areas would be put into what the EPA calls a 'non-attainment zone,' which would effectively hand control over these areas to the federal government. It would force companies to limit production that is vital to our economy and buy unnecessary expensive technology. At the same time, the American people will be subjected to higher energy prices and more regulations. ... Instead of pursuing the top-down energy policies of the Obama Administration, we should be on a path towards an unprecedented era of

energy independence and job growth. By embracing our resources and technological abilities, we can make energy cheaper and more abundant. But unfortunately, the President won't do that because his administration is full of 'science deniers' who want to make energy more expensive and push our country in the direction of energy austerity."

Announced ClearEdge
Wholesale Glass Is
Expanding To The Baton
Rouge Region That Will
Result In The Creation Of
Over 200 New Jobs.**

Gov. Bobby Jindal and business owners Brian and Dana LaBorde announced a \$2.65 million expansion of the LaBorde's business, ClearEdge Wholesale, on Monday in Baton Rouge. The LaBordes are relocating their manufacturing operation from their New Orleans site to the new 41,000 sq. ft. site in Baton Rouge. The expansion is expected to create 120 direct jobs and 113 indirect jobs in the Capital Region. "ClearEdge Wholesale Glass is a prime example of growth and job creation we are seeing across Louisiana," Jindal said. "As a result of our top-ranked business climate, more and more Louisiana companies are outgrowing their old facilities and expanding their operations to grow their businesses and provide more jobs for our people. Our world-class infrastructure and skilled workforce are giving business in Louisiana the confidence they need to continue to invest in our state."

Louisiana Employment Numbers Are At Record

Levels. Statewide nonfarm employment is at a record of about 1.99 million jobs. Private employment is up to a record of about 1.7 million jobs and about 31,000 jobs more than last year. The civilian labor force is the highest its ever been at about 2.17 million. ... Louisiana is expected to see \$100 billion in expansions and new plants in the near future, which is being driven by the low price of natural gas, the accessibility to ports to ship products and the state's friendly business climate. Job forecasts predict 63,000 new crafts workers needed through 2016, 23,000 of which are new jobs and 40,000 are replacement jobs. Unemployment claims are also trending downward in every job category.

Governor Jindal Announced Providence Food Will Establish A New Plant In Lake Providence.

Gov. Bobby Jindal and Providence Foods LLC partners Reynold Minsky and Grady Brown announced the company will establish a more than 12,000-square-foot food canning plant in Lake Providence. The new manufacturing facility will produce tomatoes, relishes and sauces through a project that will create 24 new direct jobs ... Gov. Jindal said, "Louisiana's food production is consistently celebrated around the world because we have a thriving agriculture industry that continues to be one of our state's greatest assets. Our economy is

booming because local businesses like Providence Foods continue to invest in our state and cultivate great homegrown products. Indeed this new economic development win will extend our state's legacy as a famous food producer while generating great new jobs for families in Lake Providence and the Northeast Region."
