## Governor's Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** heart disease is the leading cause of death among women, yet only 1 in 5 American women believes that heart disease is her greatest health threat; and
- WHEREAS,** cardiovascular diseases cause 1 in 3 women's deaths each year, killing approximately 1 woman every minute; and
- WHEREAS,** an estimated 43 million women in the United States are affected by cardiovascular diseases, and 90 percent of women have 1 or more risk factors for developing heart disease; and
- WHEREAS,** women comprise only 24 percent of participants in all heart-related studies; and
- WHEREAS,** since 1984, more women than men have died each year from heart disease, and the gap between men and women's survival continues to widen; and
- WHEREAS,** in 2003, the American Heart Association and the National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute, along with other organizations, started National Wear Red Day® to raise awareness of the critical issue of heart disease in women; and
- WHEREAS,** the American Heart Association also created the Go Red For Women® initiative in 2004 to empower women to take charge of their heart health and join together to end cardiovascular disease.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim February 5, 2013, as**
