SUMMARY REPORT

Meeting of Commission on Higher Education, September 9, 1982

REPORT OF CONSULTANTS ON PROGRAMS IN BUSINESS

Degree programs in business at baccalaureate and higher levels were reviewed in March, 1982, by a panel of seven out-of-State consultants chaired by Dr. William Flewellen, Jr., Dean of the School of Business at the University of Georgia. The Commission approved seven recommendations based on the report of the consultants.

NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The Commission approved eight new academic programs: (1) Associate in Business Degree in Computer Data Processing, Horry-Georgetown Technical College; (2) Emphasis Area in Travel and Tourism Within Existing B.S. in Recreation and Park Administration, Clemson University; (3) Non-teaching Options in Existing Program, B.S. in Physical Education, The Citadel; (4) M.Ed. in Social Science, The Citadel; (5) Master of Professional Accountancy, Clemson University; (6) Ph.D. in Computer Science, USC-Columbia; (7) Doctor of Philosophy and Doctor of Public Health, USC-Columbia; and (8) Piedmont Area Satellite Master in Health Science Program, Medical University of South Carolina.

REVIEW OF EXISTING PROGRAMS IN FOREIGN LANGUAGES

The Commission approved a recommendation that existing degree programs in foreign languages be reviewed in fiscal year 1982-83.

PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN USC AND MUSC

The Commission endorsed an agreement between the University of South Carolina and the Medical University of South Carolina establishing a partnership for joint participation by the two universities in the Statewide Consortium of Community Teaching Hospitals.

RICHLAND MEMORIAL HOSPITAL/USC AFFILI- ATION AGREEMENT

The Commission endorsed an Affiliation Agreement for Medical Education between Richland Memorial Hospital (Columbia) and the University of South Carolina.

CHARLESTON MEMORIAL HOSPITAL/MUSC AFFILI- ATION AGREEMENT

The Commission endorsed an Affiliation Agreement for Medical Education between the Charleston County Memorial Hospital (Charleston) and the Medical University of South Carolina.

STAFF APPOINTMENT

Dr. James A. Paschal has been appointed Coordinator of Facilities Planning on the staff of the Commission. Formerly Director of Student Affairs at Benedict College in Columbia, Dr. Paschal has also served as a teacher and educational administrator in Americus and Augusta, Georgia, respectively. He is a graduate of Xavier University in New Orleans (B.A., 1957), Fort Valley State College in Georgia (M.S., 1963) and the University of South Carolina (Ed.D., 1977).
