

This letter is written out of concern for the reputation of The Citadel and the city that it represents. The story regarding the so called "Hazing" violations reported in the newsprint recently has been exaggerated in the vast majority of the charges i.e. white slips. The charges resulting in cadets "assumed" to have been expelled may very well be from trumped up & blown out of proportion charges. Interesting that there were triple digit charges or white slips. That should tell you something.

While change is always difficult, change should be navigated in a positive manner while maintaining the reputation of the entity. The Citadel is an icon and integral part of the economic well being of Charleston in tourism and providing jobs. The history is rich and proud for this institution. This institution has had high academic standards, values, morals and taught leadership as well as prepared men and women to serve our country.

Here is the "rest of the story":

The new leadership directed by the new Commandant is not promoting honesty and integrity. Cadets are not learning and teaching leadership, but learning a Hitler mentality. The morale is an all time low. There is no chain of command. All leadership has been removed from upperclassmen. Upper class cadets are miserable and many are seeking ways out, either by transfer or study abroad. While the knob retention may be higher, revenues will be lost by upperclassmen leaving.
