Hey Melanie:

Now I have the correct grant.

EOC is eligible to apply as long as Governor identifies EOC as Lead Agency. SC qualifies under the Expansion Grant (EG) category and would need to reach and serve additional eligible four-year-olds in two high needs communities. The support and engagement of SDE and State First Steps are critical. One of the application requirements is a letter of support from an operational State Advisory Council on Early Childhood Education and Care (H. 3428 states membership of the Advisory Council is exclusively comprised of First Steps Board membership).

Think the benefit of EOC being lead agency is from the research/data perspective. A requirement is that by the end of the grant the State must have a Statewide Longitudinal Data System that links early childhood data with the State's kindergarten through grade 12 (K-12) data system.

Deadline for letter of intent is September 11, 2014.
