Charleston Business Journal: S.C. unemployment rate for August marks biggest 1-month drop in 3 decades

South Carolina's jobless rate dropped for the third consecutive month, to 6% in August, down from July's 6.4%, the state Department of Employment and Workforce reported. The decline from July to August was the largest one-month drop since 1983, the agency added.

Note: "These numbers reflect the fact that more South Carolinians are working than any time in history," Gov. Nikki Haley said. "Whether it's another business expansion, another groundbreaking or another drop in our unemployment rate, there are great things happening in our state."

Saying the establishment wing of the Republican Party is "lost" in modern Washington politics, U.S. Rep. Mick Mulvaney said Monday he would endorse U.S. Sen. Rand Paul of Kentucky for president. Mulvaney will serve as Paul's Eastern States co-chairman, the campaign announced. He is the first member of the South Carolina delegation to make an endorsement in the GOP race.
