- WHEREAS,** the ever-increasing cooperative efforts of career and technical education and business and industry stimulate the growth and vitality of South Carolina's economy, and that of the entire nation, by preparing high school graduates for postsecondary education and careers culminating in essential life skills, certified occupational skills, and meaningful employment.
