State Government News and Information

Unemployment Rate Decline : South Carolina led the nation in June with the largest 12 month decrease in the state's jobless rate according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Our state's unemployment rate was 5.3% in June -- down 2.5% from June 2013. This decrease was the largest drop over the 12 months period of any of the 50 states.

DSS Oversight Hearings Continue : Yesterday, the DSS Oversight Subcommittee which I chair held another hearing in Columbia. The subcommittee is charged with making recommendations to the General Assembly on how best to improve child protective services and foster care services in our state. We will continue meeting into the Fall and our goal is to have a report and recommendations by early January. To learn more about yesterday's hearing, go [here](#). Common Core -- FAQ and Survey : In May, legislation was enacted that removes South Carolina from Common Core State Standards with the math and english/language arts standards remaining in place for one more academic year. During that time, the State Department of Education is required to develop new, state-based K-12 standards and to have those standards implemented statewide for the 2015-2016 school year. The State Dept. of Education has established a

Teens and Texting : Texting while driving amongst younger drivers remains a problem. The State of South Carolina's anti-texting law goes into effect on December 7. Between June 9 and December 6, law enforcement may issue warning tickets. There is an anti-texting app which parents can use to keep their teen from texting while driving.
