Laurens County becomes certified Work Ready Community


One of three certified counties in South Carolina

Laurens County is a certified Work Ready Community. The county, is one of three in the state to receive this designation from ACT, a leader in college and career readiness. McCormick and Clarendon Counties have also achieved the Work Ready Community designation.

More than 1,000 Laurens County residents have completed the National Career Readiness Certificate assessment. The certificate measures work discipline, teamwork, managerial potential and customer service orientation in conjunction to core job skills.
