ABUNDANT very large number and easily seen in the proper habitat.

VERY COMMON large numbers and fairly easy to see in the proper habitat.

COMMON moderate numbers and likely to see in the proper habitat.

FAIRLY COMMON small to moderate numbers and seen most of the time in the proper habitat.

UNCOMMON small numbers and usually present in the proper habitat, but not certain to be seen.

RARE individuals may be present in the proper habitat, but may not be seen every year.

ACCIDENTAL very rare, of irregular occurrence, in the proper habitat with years between sightings.

Summer June & July

Fall August thru November

Winter December thru February





The Tom Yawkey Wildlife Center, considered one of the most outstanding gifts to wildlife conservation in North America, was willed to the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources in 1976 by the late Thomas A. Yawkey. Not only did Mr. Yawkey leave this area as a wildlife area for the future but he established the Yawkey Foundation to totally fund the operation perpetually. The Wildlife Center embraces North, South and Cat Islands, three coastal islands located at the mouth of the Winyah Bay in Georgetown County, South Carolina. Composed of nearly 24,000 acres of tidal marsh, managed wetlands, forest openings, virgin barrier island beaches, pine flatwoods and maritime forest, the Center is principally dedicated to the management of habitat for large numbers and varieties of waterfowl, wading birds, staging shorebirds, nesting eagles, and other wintering raptors. The area also serves as a major field laboratory for wildlife research. This checklist includes approximately 250 species of birds which have been documented at the Center, as well as species that are likely to occur, but have not been documented. Two weekly guided field trips by 14 passenger buses are available with prior reservation only.
