Dear friends and colleagues:

On behalf of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, I would like to invite you to a Contingency Planning Call with Deputy Secretary Jones and other senior HUD officials. As many of you are aware, annual funding for the government expires on September 30. The Administration strongly believes that a lapse in funding should not occur. By reaching a deal, Congress can prevent a lapse in appropriations, and the Administration is willing to work with Congress to enact a short-term continuing resolution to fund critical Government operations and allow Congress the time to complete the full year 2014 appropriations.

However, prudent management requires that we be prepared for all contingencies, including the possibility that a lapse could occur October 1, 2013. A lapse would mean that a number of government activities would cease due to a lack of appropriated funding. It would also mean that most employees would be temporarily furloughed. To prepare for this possibility, we have prepared a [HUD Contingency Plan 2013](#). Please pay special attention to the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) which should answer many of your questions.
