The bullying at GHS was recorded and uploaded to facebook and it showed a girl taunting, hitting, spitting and smacking a smaller boy while other students yelled and was rooting her on. The video and incident at GHS made the local news (WSPA News channel 7, Fox Carolina) if you would like to check it out. There seems to be a real problem with bullying in the Cherokee County school system. I think our community would benefit greatly by having someone come and talk to our students.

As a newspaper reporter/editor for the past 45 years in SC, I can truthfully say I feel that bullying has gotten considerably

worse in recent years - at least here in Cherokee County. You can check our Facebook site, The Cherokee Chronicle, this morning and get some details about a massive gang bullying and fight that took place at Gaffney High yesterday. A 14-year-old (girl) has been charged by police, but after viewing the video yesterday, many more should be disciplined in some way. Most of the large crowd was encouraging a large girl to continue beating on a small boy.

In a separate incident in nearby Blacksburg (also in Cherokee County), a 14-year-old girl took her own life last night, reportedly because she was being bullied.

Perhaps you could schedule a visit here to help in some way. We all must address this very serious problem. Those of us here at The Cherokee Chronicle stand ready to assist in any way we can.

I myself am starting to get concerned for my own child, he has started failing, losing interest, doesn't speak of many friends, and now he's not wanting to go to school. I don't know how to approach this with the school, I ask my son if he's being picked on but as I

expected he said "no" but my instincts and knowing the signs of bullying are saying different. Please intervene in some way with this school. Two young children from such a small school taking their own lives because of bullying is too much!
