We are pleased to announce a webinar focusing on Outreach and Recruitment for People with Dementia and their Caregivers on March 12th.

Registration is now open for the National Alzheimer's and Dementia Resource Center (formerly the ADSSP National Resource Center) Technical Assistance (TA) webinar on **Thursday, March 12th from 3:00-4:00 pm Eastern**. The March 12th webinar will provide participants with information on outreach and recruitment with two hard to reach populations of people with dementia and their caregivers. Anne Wolf will speak about efforts in South Carolina to serve rural areas of the state by providing services for people with dementia and their caregivers. Jed Levine will speak about outreach and recruitment of people with dementia and their caregivers in the lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, and transgender (LGBT) communities.

Anne Wolf currently serves as the supervisor for the Community Resources Division of the Lieutenant Governor's Office on Aging, the State Unit on Aging for South Carolina. Ms. Wolf served as the Project Director for multiple ADDGS/ADSSP grants during her tenure with the Office on Aging. She also served as the program manager for the Alzheimer's Resource Coordination Center, which provides grants to organizations for dementia – specific respite or education programs. She co-authored *Conquering the Specter of Alzheimer's Disease in South Carolina*, a state plan to address Alzheimer's disease. She was also co-author of *Take a Break SC! Sustaining South Carolina's Caregivers through Respite*.

Jed A. Levine is the Executive Vice President and Director of Programs at the Alzheimer's Association, New York City Chapter, where he has been on staff since 1990. He has taught at Columbia Mailman School of Public Health and Hunter College, School of the Health Professions. He is a member of the New York State Coordinating Council for Services Related to Alzheimer's and Other Dementias, and is a member of Senator Gillibrand's Working Group on Aging. He is the principal investigator for the Chapter's project: Palliative Care for Advanced Dementia: Training and Implementation. A frequent guest on radio and TV, Mr. Levine has presented nationally and internationally on dementia care, family caregiving, and disaster preparedness for persons with dementia.

 - b. The webinar will be broadcast via Adobe Acrobat Connect Pro. Adobe Connect requires the flash player and a high speed internet connection is recommended. Please visit the website [here](#) to test your system

to ensure you are able to log on successfully to the event. Please check your computer prior to the webinar.

2. On the day of the webinar:

- a. Enter the webinar using Internet Explorer or Firefox. These 2 programs are optimal for the webinar system we are using—Adobe Connect.
- b. Log in 5 minutes prior to the event to ensure we can start on time. You will need to enter the email address used during the registration process to enter the webinar.

3. Plan to use the webinar to view the presentation and ask questions through the chat feature.
