South Carolina GOP Censures Mark Sanford

The South Carolina Republican Party made history Monday. For the first time, it voted to censure one of its own. Gov. Mark Sanford is the recipient of the historic public scolding after his affair with an Argentine woman was revealed and dominated headlines (prior to the death of Michael Jackson).

It took the South Carolina GOP's executive committee more than four hours and multiple ballots to agree on the measure, which accuses Sanford of:

"breach[ing] the public's trust and confidence in his ability to effectively perform the duties of his office" and of failing to act in line with Republican principles.

That sounds ominous, but what practical effect does this resolution have? Maybe not all that much. The party is

not calling on him to resign, and Sanford has said he has no intention of doing so. Yes, this black mark will go down on Sanford's permanent record, but failing to act in line with Republican principles is not an actual crime. Even in South Carolina.

(CNN) -- South Carolina's Supreme Court ruled Thursday that Gov. Mark Sanford must accept \$700 million in federal stimulus money, ending the only formal effort by a governor to reject funding intended to jump-start an ailing economy.

Gov. Mark Sanford became the conservative face of opposition to the federal stimulus package.

The two-term Republican said he would abide by the court ruling, but called it a bad day for South Carolina and the country.

"This decision is terrible news for every taxpayer in South Carolina, and even more so for future taxpayers who will ultimately bear the responsibility of paying for this so-called 'stimulus' without seeing any benefit from it," he said in a statement.

Considered a potential future Republican presidential candidate, Sanford led the party's resistance to the \$787 billion stimulus package. He warned the increased spending will bring an insurmountable debt burden on future generations.

Sanford initially tried to require that any stimulus money pay down the state debt, a stance rejected by the Obama administration.

Sanford had resisted taking the money even when the Republican-controlled legislature passed a budget that included the funds.

Students and education officials in South Carolina filed lawsuits demanding that the governor take the money. Sanford tried to have those suits merged and heard in federal court.

On Monday, however, a federal judge rejected that effort, and said that the South Carolina Supreme Court must decide what to do.

In its ruling, the state's highest court said the legislature, not Sanford, has the power to decide whether to accept the federal stimulus money.

"At this stage in the process, the Governor certainly has no discretion to make a contradictory decision on behalf of the State," the ruling said. "We hold the Governor must apply for the ... funds." Watch report on Gov. Sanford's policy defeat »

However, the court distanced itself from any role in setting policy on the issue.

"Our decision today should not be construed as a comment on the policy differences between Governor Sanford and the General Assembly respecting the wisdom or necessity of South Carolina accepting the" money, it said. ... "We discharge our duty to honor the rule of law, nothing more."

The ruling was in response to lawsuits filed by two students and a school administrators' association that sought to force the state to accept the stimulus money, some of which will go for education needs.

I've had several requests for updates on the Lowcountry Coosaw luncheons we've been doing.

We've gotten together several times for discussions over lunch. We had an excellent turnout at the last gathering, as approximately 20 people came out for fellowship. That is more than double the attendance we had at the previous meeting, and the interest continues to grow at an impressive rate!

In our last luncheon a few weeks ago we heard a presentation from Governor Sanford's former Deputy Chief of Staff, Chad Walldorf. Davis-Bacon Wage Provisions Depress the Economy

Congress has included a little-known provision in the economic stimulus legislation that wastes tax dollars and costs jobs. All \$188 billion worth of construction projects funded in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (H.R. 1) must pay Davis-Bacon prevailing wage rates. This requirement will inflate construction costs by \$17 billion and depress the economy.

If, on the other hand, Congress paid market wages, the same appropriations would fund more

projects and create more jobs. Alternatively, Congress could give \$110 tax rebate to single filers and a \$220 tax rebate to joint filers for the same cost. Including the Davis-Bacon requirements gives some workers a windfall with no benefit to the public. Before extending prevailing wage requirements to the stimulus bill, Congress should require the Department of Labor to use an accurate and scientific methodology to calculate prevailing wages.

The Davis-Bacon Act

The Davis-Bacon Act requires federal construction contractors to pay at least the prevailing wage rates for non-federal construction projects located in the same areas as their federal project. Supporters consider Davis-Bacon an important means of preventing the government's buying power from distorting construction labor markets. In areas where the government is the largest buyer of construction services, it could use its negotiating power to lower construction wages.

Contrary to its purpose, the Davis-Bacon Act distorts construction labor markets. Davis-Bacon wages bear little relation to market wages, because the government's prevailing wage estimates are wildly inaccurate. In some cities, Davis-Bacon rates are much higher than market wages. In Long Island, New York, for example, market rates for plumbers are \$29.68 an hour.[1] Davis-Bacon rates, however, are \$44.75 an hour--51 percent more than what the market demands.[2] In other cities, Davis-Bacon wages are significantly below market rates. For instance, Davis-Bacon rates for carpenters and plumbers in Sarasota, Florida, are \$6.55 an hour, a figure below Florida's minimum wage of \$7.21.[3] Nationwide, Davis-Bacon rates average 22 percent above market wages and inflate the cost of federal construction by 10 percent.[4]

Davis-Bacon in the Stimulus

H.R. 1 applies Davis-Bacon restrictions to all construction projects directly or indirectly funded in the legislation--over \$188 billion worth of projects.[5] The new schools, highways, hospitals, and other construction in the act will be built by contractors paying inflated Davis-Bacon rates. This requirement will add \$17 billion to construction costs.[6]

Depresses the Economy

Davis-Bacon restrictions ensure that the infrastructure spending--such as that provided for in H.R. 1--will yield as little economic benefit as possible. The \$17 billion is spent paying a premium for work that employees would do at market wages. Without Davis-Bacon inflating costs, construction spending would go farther, funding more projects and creating more jobs. Including Davis-Bacon restrictions in the stimulus bill lines the pockets of some workers at the cost of both fewer jobs and fewer schools and highways built.

Davis-Bacon restrictions are also an inefficient and ineffective way to increase Americans' purchasing power. There is no economic reason to give federal construction workers--but no other workers--inflated wages. If Congress wants to spend \$17 billion to increase Americans' purchasing power, it could use that money to give a \$110 tax rebate to single filers and a \$220 tax rebate to joint filers.[7] Such a rebate would broadly benefit all workers instead of just those who happen to work in construction.

Flawed Estimates

Davis-Bacon wages badly distort construction markets and federal spending because the Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor uses unscientific and inaccurate methods to calculate wage rates.[8] Indeed, the inspector general has found three significant flaws that distort Davis-Bacon rates[9]:

a.. Unscientific Methodology. The Wage and Hour Division does not use a scientific random sample of construction contractors.

b.. Survey Errors. The inspector general's office found errors in 100 percent of audited returned survey forms.

c.. Outdated Surveys. It takes over two years to conduct a survey and then years to update the survey after its completion. In some counties, Davis-Bacon rates have not been updated since the 1970s.

These flaws cause Davis-Bacon wages to bear little resemblance to market wages. There is no reason for Congress to pay workers on \$188 billion worth of construction projects wages that are based on unscientific, inaccurate estimates.

Recommendations to Congress

The Davis-Bacon Act inflates the wages of some construction workers and depresses the wages of others. Including it in the stimulus bill will drive up construction costs by \$17 billion and cost jobs on projects that could have been funded with that extra money. Therefore, Congress should strip Davis-Bacon requirements from the stimulus bill.

If Congress intends to keep prevailing wage requirements in the stimulus legislation, it should at least ensure that prevailing wages are scientifically estimated. Congress already spends over half a billion dollars a year on the Bureau of Labor Statistics, an agency that accurately estimates wage statistics using scientific methods. At the very least, Congress should require the Department of Labor use scientific estimates to calculate Davis-Bacon rates.

Dear Friends,

Whether you've kept up with the trillion dollar so-called "stimulus plan" up in Washington D.C. or not, the Senate passed a version of the plan earlier today, and the choices our Congressmen make in the next few days as they decide on a final bill will have long-lasting consequences.

For that reason, I'd ask you once again to join me in making your voice heard on three key fronts.

First, we've got a real problem with this stimulus package for the way it piles debt on top of debt, for the way that much of its spending is not stimulative in nature, and for the way this series of ad hoc measures is freezing up the very private capital that ultimately drives our economy.

Second, we're moving precipitously close to what I would call a "savior-based economy" - close to what you see in Russia or Venezuela or Zimbabwe or places like that where it matters not how good your product is to the consumer but what your political connection is to those in power. That's very different than a market-based economy where some rise and some fall but there's a consequence to making unwise decisions.

And third, we're disturbed with the way the rules seem to be changing every week or so, with the expanded power given to Treasury and the Federal Reserve, and with the lack of accountability in how

these trillions of taxpayer dollars are actually being spent.

There's still a chance to impact the process since nothing is ever inevitable in the world of politics - evidenced by the fact that President Obama actually hit the road to campaign for this trillion dollar spending bill. Given the stakes involved, there are a lot of things each one of us can do to make our voice heard, just as the President has.

Would you send an email to a friend in another state, pick up the phone and call a cousin or other relative across the country, and ask them to make a call and then gather a few of their friends to do the same. Because if enough people make their voices heard on this, we can still impact the short term debate for what will be a decidedly long term direction we take as a country.

Closing the USC-Union branch would be a big mistake. Union County doesn't have anything more to offer its students who cannot afford to go away to college than this campus. I speak from experience. I attended USC-Union to get my basic courses before transferring to USC-S. If it hadn't been for that school, I would not have the education I have today. I am thankful that I could go close to home so that it would not cost so much for me to finish my degree. I got an excellent education at USC-Union, and my time there allowed me to be able to work full time and go to school to pay for it as well. Both my daughters went there as well, and it helped our family a lot because it was close to home. One of my daughters recently took more classes there as well to improve her job situation. We need that school for our children and grandchildren.

Closing our Union branch not only deprives the students in our county of an education, but it also deprives the students in Laurens of an education as well. USC-Union provides a satellite program for Laurens. I know that because I taught for them as an adjunct professor in Laurens for several semesters in an effort to give back and help others get an education. The education of our children should come before anything else. I realize that we have to make cuts and that the economy is in crisis; however, whatever the state provides for that school is money well spent because of all the students it serves. Taking it away only deprives more students of an education and is likely to keep them in poverty. We don't need more poor people in this county. Dear Governor and Mrs. Sanford,

I hope this email finds you both well. I am writing you tonight to ask for your opinion and possibly some help on a matter that concerns a state agency. I know my email will probably be lengthy and I will apologize in advance for it. I am just at my wits end and do not know where to turn. Basically, I feel that I am being borderline harassed by my ex husband about his having to pay child support and he is using DSS Child Support Enforcement to do it. I personally think it is not right nor fair for someone like him to abuse this agency and use it for their own advantage.

First of all, a little background on me: I was married to my ex husband for 14 years. I left him three days before I gave birth to our youngest child. When I left, he refused to help me in any way financially because he wanted me to fail so I would have no other choice but to come back to him. I was forced to go on welfare. As you know, when you apply for welfare benefits, they make you file for DSS child support enforcement if you are a child's non custodial parent who will not or is not supporting their children. I also had a private attorney at the time who filed for divorce in [REDACTED] County on my behalf at this time. It was my private attorney who in fact got child support started through family court and paid through family court for my children. The agency DSS Child Support Enforcement did not initiate my children's child support.

To make a long story short, I was on welfare a very short time, my attorney got my child support started and I was able to go to school get a certificate and ending up getting a great job with [REDACTED] County. I now work for a [REDACTED] County Summary Court. I am telling you this because I worked hard to pull myself up from being a single mother of three kids with NOTHING to be where I am today. I am a home owner, I am a tax payer, and I am a productive citizen. I used the welfare system for what it is intended for.... a step UP..... NOT a hand out and I am very proud of myself for doing so.

What my ex husband has done is manage to lose his great paying job he had when we were married and he makes no real effort to find gainful employment again. He says he does not want to get a good paying job because he will just have to pay me half of his paycheck in child support. When we separated, he made nearly 50,000.00 a year working for a Toyota dealership as an automotive technician. He keeps going to DSS Child Support Enforcement, paying the 40.00 fee and hauling ME back into court to try to get it reduced. He did this about a year ago, and we went to court. I had an attorney with me and we told the caseworker we would not agree to a reduction in child support because he was not employed to his ability. (He was claiming at the time to be making LESS then the minimum wage.) The caseworker said they would set the case up before a Family Court Judge. The court date was set and when we arrived for court and the people at DSS Child Support Enforcement told me and my attorney they had closed his case and that if he wanted his child support reduced, he would have to hire a private attorney and bring it before the court that way.

I have recently received yet another letter in the mail from DSS Child Support Services. The letter informs me that I have a negotiation conference concerning my child support case to be held at 2:30 on December 12, 2008 at the Family Court in [REDACTED] County. That it is necessary that I be present at this conference. It also states that if I fail to appear for the conference, they will request that my TANF check be reduced or if I do not receive a TANF check, they will request that my case be closed. I have not received any kind of check TANF or otherwise from DSS since sometime in 1999! So to be quite honest, I considered not even going. I am not receiving any form of welfare and haven't in years, so I figured I had



nothing to lose. Then the next thing I know, I am being SERVED a paper by a deputy sheriff at my home. The officer who served them said they were for me. They read like they are for my ex husband. HIS name is on it like they have served the papers on HIM...only they were served to ME...at MY home. Now I can only assume that I am being required to take time off of work again to go to court again. I have to find an attorney to go with me again. All because I have an ex husband who doesn't want to get a decent job so he can afford to pay child support for his children. He wants to pay the bare minimum for child support. I know they will reduce it based solely on the only the guidelines because he isn't even working now at all. His Mother pays his child support for him and he is a 43 year old man.

I guess what I need to know is this possible? Can a man go pay a 40.00 fee to a state agency that is supposed to establish child support for children and get it reduced or taken away? Even when he is capable of making a decent amount of pay? He just chooses not to? It seems to me that his life's goal now is to go ON with himself. So he doesn't get a good job, he gets Food Stamps and Medicaid and now all he wants to do is get his child support reduced to the bare minimal of about 40.00 a week so he can be a lazy deadbeat dad. I just don't think that is right or just. Especially when I have worked so hard to overcome the hardships that my children and I have been through over the years. Also, how often can this man keep making me come to court through DSS Child Support Enforcement? If I am not mistaken, I can't take him back for a review of his wages but once every 3 years. (Which I never have.) I don't believe it has been 3 years since he had me in there last time.

Again, I do apologize for the length of this email. I just felt that someone needed to know how one man, in my opinion, is abusing a state agency. I am looking forward to your reply. I am almost certain you will be nearly as outraged as I am.

Enclosed are the materials that were distributed at Tuesday's Economic Development Press Conference. In summary, the legislative leadership announced a "Knowledge Sector Council," under the direction of the SC Research Authority. This organization will coordinate the State's effort to attract high paying jobs and build the knowledge economy in the state. New Carolina, the South Chamber and the Palmetto Institute are all part of that Council. The Knowledge Economy Sector was one of three pillars for sustained economic success. The other pillars are a manufacturing, distribution and services sector, headed up by the Department of Commerce, and a Tourism Sector headed up by PRT.

Regarding the pillar we have a good relationship with the Department of Commerce and they have been actively involved with many of our initiatives. The Tourism Cluster Committee and now the SC Tourism Alliance have been working with PRT on economic development in the tourism sector for the last three years.

We look forward to sharing our progress on clusters with other members of the Knowledge Economy Council. I believe that our collective efforts will reduce unemployment and increase per capita income.

Finally, the press kit included a list of legislative initiatives to promote the knowledge based economy over the past five years. These initiatives are very consistent with three of Dr. Porter's recommendations: Invest in Research and the University System, Enhance Education and Workforce Development and Increase Support for Startups. We have accelerated these initiatives and had already planned to celebrate progress in the knowledge economy in this year's Annual Report. You all remember Sheriff Joe Arpaio of Arizona , who painted the jail cells pink and made the inmates



wear pink prison garb. Well.....

SHERIFF JOE IS AT IT AGAIN!

Oh, there's MUCH more to know about Sheriff Joe!

Maricopa County was spending approx. \$18 million dollars a year on stray animals, like cats and dogs. Sheriff Joe offered to take the department over, and the County Supervisors said okay.

The animal shelters are now all staffed and operated by prisoners. They feed and care for the strays. Every animal in his care is taken out and walked twice daily. He now has prisoners who are experts in animal nutrition and behavior. They give great classes for anyone who'd like to adopt an animal. He has literally taken stray dogs off the street, given them to the care of prisoners, and had them place in dog shows.

The best part? His budget for the entire department is now under \$3 million. Teresa and I adopted a Weimaraner from a Maricopa County shelter two years ago. He was neutered, and current on all shots, in great health, and even had a microchip inserted the day we got him. Cost us \$78.

The prisoners get the benefit of about \$0.28 an hour for working, but most would work for free, just to be out of their cells for the day. Most of his budget is for utilities, building maintenance, etc. He pays the prisoners out of the fees collected for adopted animals.

I have long wondered when the rest of the country would take a look at the way he runs the jail system, and copy some of his ideas. He has a huge farm, donated to the county years ago, where inmates can work, and they grow most of their own fresh vegetables and food, doing all the work and harvesting by hand. He has a pretty good sized hog farm, which provides meat, and fertilizer. It fertilizes the Christmas tree nursery, where prisoners work, and you can buy a living Christmas tree for \$6 - \$8 for the Holidays, and plant it later. We have six trees in our yard from the Prison.

Yup, he was reelected last year with 83% of the vote.

Now he's in trouble with the ACLU again. He painted all his buses and vehicles with a mural, that has a special hotline phone number painted on it, where you can call and report suspected illegal aliens.

Immigrations and Customs Enforcement wasn't doing enough in his eyes, so he had 40 deputies trained specifically for enforcing immigration laws, started up his hotline, and bought 4 new buses just for hauling folks back to the border. He's kind of a 'Git-R Dun' kind of Sheriff.

Remember Lee Iacocca, the man who rescued Chrysler Corporation from it's death throes?

He's now 82 years old and has a new book, and here are some excerpts.

Lee Iacocca Says:

'Am I the only guy in this country who's fed up with

what's happening? Where the hell is our outrage? We should be screaming bloody murder. We've got a gang of clueless bozos steering our ship of state right over a cliff, we've got corporate gangsters stealing us blind, and we can't even clean up after a hurricane much less build a hybrid car. But instead of getting mad, everyone sits around and nods their heads when the politicians say, 'Stay the course'

Stay the course? You've got to be kidding. This is < st1:country-region w:st="on">America , not the damned 'Titanic'. I'll give you a sound bite: 'Throw all the bums out!'

You might think I'm getting senile, that I've gone off my rocker, and maybe I have. But someone has to speak up. I hardly recognize this country anymore.

The most famous business leaders are not the innovators but the guys in handcuffs. While we're fiddling in Iraq , the Middle East is burning and nobody seems to know what to do. And the press is waving 'pom -poms' instead of asking hard questions. That's not the promise of the ' America ' my parents and yours traveled across the ocean for. I've had enough. How about you?

I'll go a step furth er. You can't call yourself a patriot if you're not outraged. This is a fight I'm ready and willing to have. The Biggest 'C' is Crisis ! (Iacocca elaborates on nine Cs of leadership, crisis being the first.)

Leaders are made, not born. Leadership is forged in times of crisis. It's easy to sit there with your feet up on the desk and talk theory. Or send someone else's kids off to war when you've never seen a battlefield yourself. It's another thing to lead when your world comes tumbling down.

On September 11, 2001, we needed a strong leader more than any other time in our history. We needed a steady hand to guide us out of the ashes. A Hell of a Mess So here's where we stand. We're immersed in a bloody war with no plan for winning and no plan for leaving. We're running the biggest deficit in the history of the country. We're losing the manufactur ing edge to Asia , while our once-great companies are getting slaughtered by health care costs. Gas prices are skyrocketing, and nobody in power has a coherent energy policy. Our schools are in trouble. Our borders are like sieves. The middle class is being squeezed every which way These are times that cry out for leadership.

But when you look around, you've got to ask:' Where have all the leaders gone?' Where are the curious, creative

communicators? Where are the people of character, courage, conviction, omnipotence, and common sense? may be a sucker for alliteration, but I think you get the point.

Name me a leader who has a better idea for homeland security than making us take off our shoes in airports and throw away our shampoo? We've spent billions of dollars building a huge new bureaucracy, and all we know now how to do is react to things that have already happened.

Name me one leader who emerged from the crisis of Hurricane Katrina. Congress has yet to spend a single day evaluating the response to the hurricane, or demanding accountability for the decisions that were made in the crucial hours after the storm.

Everyone's hunkering down, fingers crossed, hoping it doesn't happen again. Now, that's just crazy. Storms happen. Deal with it. Make a plan. Figure out what you're going to do the next time.

Name me an industry leader who is thinking creatively about how we can restore our competitive edge in manufacturing. Who would have believed that there could ever be a time when 'The Big Three' referred to Japanese car companies? How did this happen, and more important, what are we going to do about it?

Name me a government leader who can articulate a plan for paying down the debt, or solving the energy crisis, or managing the health care problem. The silence is deafening. But these are the crises that are eating away at our country and milking the middle class dry.

I have news for the gang in Congress. We didn't elect you to sit on your asses and do nothing and remain silent while our democracy is being hijacked and our greatness is being replaced with mediocrity. What is everybody so afraid of? That some bonehead on Fox News will call them a name? Give me a break. Why don't you guys show some spine for a change?

Had Enough?

Hey, I'm not trying to be the voice of gloom and doom here. I'm trying to light a fire. I'm speaking out because I have hope I believe in America. In my lifetime I've had the privilege of living through some of America's greatest moments. I've also

experienced some of our worst crises: the 'Great Depression', 'World War II', the 'Korean War', the 'Kennedy Assassination', the 'Vietnam War', the 1970s oil

crisis, and the struggles of recent years culminating with 9/11. If I've learned

one thing, it's this: 'You don't get anywhere by standing on the sidelines waiting for somebody else to take action. Whether it's building a better car or building a better future for our children, we all have a role to play. That's the challenge I'm raising in this book. It's a call to 'Action' for people who, like me, believe in America. It's not too late, but it's getting pretty close. So let's shake off the crap and go to work. Let's tell 'em all we've had 'enough.'

Dear fellow encampment camper:

It was a pleasure to spend the better part of the weekend with you and in its wake I wanted to send a few thoughts and ask for yours.

You first. In the spirit of an after action review - what would you do more of, less of or about the same?

Timing. Is the weekend we went on before Memorial Day better - or a little later, specifically 1st weekend in June?

Here are mine:

I thought it went well and am appreciative of all from people like Roy and John to Bryan and others for all they and so many of you did to make the weekend a success.

My objectives were four fold:

1. To gather folks of a similar mindset so that we can be encouraged in the fact that we are not alone in a desire to expand liberty -and consequently limit government's growth and reach. I need this because at times one feels like you are out there on your own in wanting limited government - and a weekend like this reminds me of the fact that this is not the case.

2. To build "esprit de corps." I know we are too old for the camping thing but shared hardship - whether in camping or having to balance on a slab of concrete to take a shower - brings people together in a way that no cocktail or dinner event can. Given the fact that we were out there and in a remote location, there was some bonding that I think is important to galvanizing a team to take on government's never ending growth.

3. To catch up with old friends and make newer ones stronger. I found myself a little too much in operational world to do as I would have liked on this, but that probably goes with the first "encampment" out of the shoot - and I think I could get better from here.

4. To be a better steward of Coosaw. This is not a category you probably care a whole lot about, but something inside has been chewing on me on this over the last few years. I love it and think it is a remarkable spot; I am just as convinced that when I leave this planet I am not taking it with me. I am but a one-quarter steward, and within the context of not changing its use as a family place I have been looking for ways to have better used this "talent" that God sent my way.

Back to here and now - now the question lies in what we do from here and a good part of that indeed lies in your hands, in that there are endless ways to engage in the battle of liberty. Whether in getting others involved, in sending a letter to the editor, in sending a check to a candidate or something like Reform SC or Carolinians for Reform - there are lots of ways to get involved.

So that more of you might find ways of coming up with your own ideas on this front, I have attached the email and address list from the weekend. Many of you asked for it. My only request is that it is not used for commercial purposes.

I will be in touch over the weeks and months ahead in specific ways/opportunities to get involved, and I ask that you discard the ones that don't fit and lock onto the one, or few that do.

Going forward on the weekend my vision would be the following:

That the Coosaw Encampment become a very special and unique once a year weekend where old friendships are rekindled and where new ones are

sparked. Its higher purpose is to rekindle in each of us not just an appreciation for the sense of adventure born to each of us, and with it our tie to the outdoors and natural beauty - but a commitment to the cause of liberty and to reminding each of us that we are not alone in the struggle that goes with liberty's defense.

At a tactical and operational level this means the following things over the next year:

One, if you want to be part of the planning process and be given a job in organizing next year let me know.

Two, despite Lindsey's fun suggestions this was an expensive weekend to put on so if you have money saving ideas on how to get things done, or resources to bear, let me know.

Three, I think slowly growing the group and consequently our collective leverage is important if we want to have big name national speakers from across the country. This is not for a moment suggesting Roy or others weren't, but Roy came as a favor and there are a limited number of favors we will be able to pull in on this. Speakers/entertainers will cost, and it has to be worth their time in political terms. So unless we want to dramatically increase the tariff -and I don't, that may need to be the long-term direction.

Bohemian Grove in California has about 3000 over the peak weekend. It lasts about two weeks and begins with them sending a barge out into their little lake and on it they burn the devil known as "care." During those two weeks they are to leave "care" behind - and all the other entanglements that go with modern day life. Over the years they have divided up into camps and have very rustic spots set permanently in the woods - that host each "camp."

Accordingly as each of you are founding members of our own encampment, I would say that one of the privileges that ought to go with being a pioneer in this thing is that each of you ought to be entitled with inviting up to 3 other friends in building your own "camp." I'll have to play with this, as it might be the direction to go - or alternatively a dues and membership thing with invited guests - I'm not sure - but let's brainstorm on it for the next year. Should we go the guest route for original participants the two requirements would be (one) that they fit in with mission above in wanting to be a part of liberty's defense and growth and accordingly are committed to making financial and time commitments to advancing this cause - and (two) that they be in General

Dear Friends,

It's May 12, and South Carolinians are heading to the airport and walking into federal buildings without a problem. But things could have turned out differently.

Earlier this year, our Administration decided to say "no thanks" to a federal unfunded mandate called Real ID that would have established a de facto national ID card – costing you time in line at the DMV and money out of your pocket. Instead, we asked that South Carolinians be treated like citizens of every other state when traveling, since our state's driver's licenses are already some of the most secure in the nation.

Fortunately, the Department of Homeland Security recognized our state's secure driver's licenses, and decided not to stop our citizens from flying or entering federal buildings – something that would have happened starting yesterday, May 11.

Real ID is a backdoor federal program that would require all fifty states to change their driver's licenses to effectively act as national ID cards. This law is fatally flawed for the way it was not debated and not funded from the federal level, and because it usurps prerogatives that have traditionally been granted to states and individuals.

I could go on and on with more of the details that you may or may not want to know, so I'll provide a few links in case you want to read more about the Real ID debate:

All of us as taxpayers and concerned citizens must become more involved and aware of how our tax dollars are being spent. On February 28, 2008, the Director of Charleston County's Department of Social Services (DSS) retired with full benefits. The following week she was rehired to be the Regional Supervisor for DSS with full salary. So, she's receiving full retirement plus a full salary, taking "double dipping" to a new high.

The salary and retirement package is not the only issue. She has been the County Director for years, overseeing the very office that is fraught with significant managerial issues, yet she is now going to supervise that very office in addition to others.

Within DSS, insiders say the following:

1. Poor upper management employees.
2. There is a double standard at work - the "good old boy/girl" system is rampant.
3. Many supervisors lack management skills, resulting in a high turnover rate.
4. Case workers have too many children to oversee resulting in very poor assessments and investigations.
5. There is no accountability with foster parents to ensure their foster children attend doctors, therapists, and educational appointments.
6. Pre-adoption families are held to a higher standard for homes than are foster/relative placement. Case in point: A child is in a foster home for 2+ years. The home is deemed suitable. Same foster mother applies to adopt the child. DSS Adoptions says "home needs new windows, so in case of a fire, firemen can get through window." One could therefore assume Foster Homes or Relative Placement Homes don't catch on fire, only pre-adopt homes. Same home, same child - different standards.
7. There are supervisors and caseworkers who disappear on a daily basis, not responding to pages or mobile calls, not even answering calls from intake when emergency calls come in, leaving no one available to investigate abuse/neglect.
8. Workers continuing to leave children in homes for months and months where parents are using illegal drugs and participating in domestic violence. DSS has a "new" policy of not removing children, leaving them to be exposed to abuse and/or neglect.
9. DSS is not following court orders instructing them to file actions to



terminate parents' rights, until months and months have passed.

10. Children languishing in foster care waiting for adoption and DSS Adoption workers taking months to conduct a home study.

11. DSS supervisors are not meeting with their employees for weeks and weeks.

12. DSS worker who thinks a bare, urine-stained mattress in every bedroom with no other furniture in the entire house meets "minimum standard of care."

13. Sexual abuse cases that are not filed with the court for months and months.

South Carolina is one of seven states that requires all children, regardless of age, to testify in criminal court, even when the child has been sexually abused.

Sexual abuse cases covering a span of years are pled down to assault and battery (involving minor children).

Detectives, rather than the Solicitor, determining which cases should be prosecuted.

Solicitors deciding to prosecute cases (or not) based on whether they think they "can win."

A DSS attorney who is so incompetent, private practice attorneys consider his actions tantamount to malpractice.
