
Dear Governor Haley:

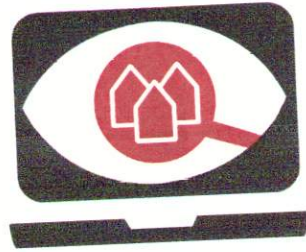

With NANWO, a local Neighborhood Watch organization or an expanded Homeland Security association has the ability to communicate easily with interested parties. Even if a particular neighborhood does not have a formal Neighborhood Watch or Homeland Security organization in place, NANWO allows an awareness to be established in just a few minutes.

### WHY NANWO?

Local and international incidents that could potentially affect our personal and community security are reported every day. There has never been a better time for us to stay informed concerning the happenings where we live, work, and play. **NOW IS THE TIME.** Rather than wait until after a negative event has occurred, the time to establish a community awareness network is now.

### HOW DO WE ORGANIZE?

The easiest way to protect your community is to add these available communications features to your local (already established) Neighborhood Watch organization. The current Neighborhood Coordinator will welcome the NANWO "completely automatic" system. There is no database management chore for him/her. If your community doesn't have an established Neighborhood Watch-Homeland Security organization (or you're not sure if there is one), simply join as an individual and "Invite Others."
